Impact of Sports Premium Funding 2016-17

Our allocation of Sports Premium funding is £8820. The Government's guidance about how to spend this money is as follows:

Purpose of funding

Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and Sport, with the discretion of how this is achieved with the Headteacher and Governors

Possible uses for the funding might include:

- hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work with primary teachers when teaching PE
- supporting and encouraging the least active children through new or additional Change4Life clubs
- paying for professional development opportunities for teachers in PE and sport
- providing cover to release primary teachers of professional development in PE and sport
- running sport competitions, or increasing pupils' participation in the School Games
- buying quality assured professional development modules or materials for PE and sport
- providing places for pupils on after school sports clubs and holiday clubs
- pooling the additional funding with that of other local schools

Use of funding at Beaupré Community Primary School

- to support the cost of specialist sports teachers to work with Years 1 - 6 (2 hours each week per class). To improve the quality of PE teaching throughout the school. To work alongside and develop Teaching Assistants when teaching Physical Education for these children to enable us to enhance the provision of Physical Education across the school.
- to buy in specialist sports teachers to run three after school Multi skills clubs for; Years 1 and 2 (extended to Reception midway through the year), Years 3 and 4, Years 5 and 6. To introduce and encourage participation in extra curricular activity in sports and physical development.
- to buy in a specialist sports teacher to run a lunchtime play leader session every day to encourage physical develop, team games and sports activities for all children
- to enable the school to run an after school football club providing training and skills and participate in a football league playing matches against other schools, for year 5 and 6 pupils
- to buy in additional swimming coaches to teach swimming groups for all groups from Reception to Year 6 to support and enhance our existing commitment to this sport

Impact of Sports Premium Funding

The Governors are committed to ensuring that the Sports Premium funding has a measurable and lasting impact on the quality of PE at Beaupré Community Primary School. Sports club weekly attendance in 2016-17 was as follows:

Investment in additional sports coaching has been effective in widening pupil's sporting experiences and enabling them to develop skills in different physical activities throughout the school day. Staff

have benefitted from working alongside coaches to develop their own skills in teaching and leading PE sessions.

There has been a good level of uptake for extra-curricular clubs across the school. Pupil commitment has increased throughout the year and more pupils attend clubs once signed up than at the start of the year. Pupils enjoy participating in the clubs, have developed their confidence, team skills and wellbeing.

Investment in extra swimming coaches has enable smaller adult to child ratios, therefore impacting on the rate in which children become more confident in water and learn the skills and awareness needed to be safe in the water.
