Important Information

Drop Off and Collection Reminder

We have had an increasing number of parents passing on messages in the playground in the mornings. We are all really missing the normal morning and after school conversations and having the opportunity to listen to your thoughts, concerns and the relationship this builds with you. However, during these times we still need to ensure everyone's safety. Can we please, therefore, remind you that if you do have a message or you need to pass on information, that this is done by telephoning or emailing the school office, or emailing the class teacher. This ensures social distancing and enables messages and information to be passed on.

We would also like to remind you to remain socially distanced from other parents and children when dropping off and collecting your children, particularly when your children are in their class line. We ask that children are supervised at all times, walking with you whilst coming to school and when exiting the playground through the staff car park. Again, this is to support social distancing, non-mixing of children not in the same bubble and the safety of children from moving vehicles. We thank you for your continued support.

Parents' Evening

Due to current Covid-19 guidelines, we will be carrying out Parents' Evening by telephone this year.

Parents' evening appointments will be held during the week of 19th October, with different class teachers holding their sessions on different days. Each call has an allocated time of 10 minutes. Appointments for these calls will again be made through ParentMail.

You will be able to book slots from Monday 12th October at 8.00am via ParentMail.

School Photographs—19th October

Tempest will be in school on Monday 19th October for a morning photography session.

On the day of the photo shoot, the photographer will have a social distanced studio in the hall; this will be a walk through, standing pose studio with a coloured background. The photographer will be 2m from the children and will not be touching, positioning or adjusting the children or their uniform.

Unfortunately, we are unable to offer in school sibling or preschool sibling photographs this year, as this would compromise 'bubbles'. I'm sure that you appreciate this is to keep your children and everyone safe.

This year, proofs will be sent to the school office a day or two after the photo shoot. These will then be sent home with your children.

You can place orders and pay online. Unfortunately, there will be no option to bring the payments to school as there has been in previous years. There will be a postage charge if you chose to have your orders delivered to your home address, or you can chose to have them delivered to school free of charge and we will distribute the orders to children, to bring home.



Important Information

Data Collection Sheets

In the coming week we will be sending home a data sheet with each child. This shows the information we hold on our system for your child. It is very important that you check this is up to date and correct.

We will send a Doodlepoll via ParentMail for you to advise if the sheet we sent home is correct, or if amendments are needed. It is imperative that this poll is completed and it should take no longer than 2 minutes to complete. If you have any questions or problems, please contact the school office.

Attendance

If your child is unwell and not able to attend school you must telephone the school office to advise us of the nature of the illness and expected length of absence. We ask that you call us every day that your child is absent. If we do not hear from you, we will send messages and call you for reasons of absence. If we can not contact you we may need to carry out a home visit. This, I am sure you will understand, is to ensure that you and your children are safe and well.

The Law

Parents have a legal duty to ensure that their child receives an education suitable to his/her age, ability and aptitude and any special needs. Most parents fulfill this obligation by registering their child in a school.

Should it be considered that as a parent you are unwilling or unable to ensure your child attends school regularly without good reason you could be:

- subject to a Penalty Notice fine;
- prosecuted in a Magistrates Court and fined up to £2,500 and/or imprisoned for up to 3 months;
- made the subject of a Parenting Order;

Your child may be made the subject of an Education Supervision Order in the Family Court.

Compulsory school age:

From: 1 September, 1 January, 1 April following the child's fifth birthday To: the last Friday in June in the school year in which the child is sixteen (1 September to 31 August)

Introduction

Receiving a good full-time education will give your child the best possible start in life. Attending school regularly and punctually is essential if children are to make the most of the opportunities available to them.

Government research suggests that 17 missed school days a year = 1 GCSE grade DROP in achievement.

What you can do to help

- Make sure your child arrives at school on time. This encourages habits of good timekeeping and lessens any possible classroom disruption. If your child arrives after the register has closed without a good reason, this will be recorded as an 'unauthorised' absence for that session.
- If your child has to miss school it is vital that you let the school know why, preferably on the first morning of the absence. (Your child's school will have an attendance policy explaining how this should be done).
- If you know or think that your child is having difficulties attending school you should contact the school. It is better to do this sooner rather than later, as most problems can be dealt with very quickly.

Authorised and Unauthorised Absence

If your child is absent and school either does not receive an explanation from you, or considers the explanation unsatisfactory, it will record your child's absence as 'unauthorised'.

Most absences for acceptable reasons will be authorised by your child's school:

- Sickness;
- Unavoidable medical or dental appointments (if possible, arrange these for after school or during school holidays);
- · Days of religious observance;
- COVID related absence where child is either suffering from the virus/ shielding/ is in Enforced Quarantine.

Leave of Absence

The Government has removed the discretion on head teachers agreeing to term time leave requests. Due to the disruptive effect on a child's education, you are strongly urged to avoid booking a family holiday during termtime. Parents do not have any right or entitlement to take their child out of school for a term-time leave / holiday.

Any leave of absence requests will be considered by the school in **exceptional circumstances** and will look at each request individually.

School Attendance

Information for Parents/Carers

What constitutes as exceptional circumstances has not been dictated by the Government. Individual head teachers will be making the final decision on whether to authorise the leave of absence or not.

Any unauthorised leave of absence could result in a Penalty Notice fine being issued. As an alternative to prosecution, parents may be subject to a Penalty fine of £120 (reducing to £60 if paid within 21 days). Nonpayment of this fine will result in case being listed for prosecution in the Magistrates Courts, without further warning being issued.

Education Attendance Service

Please note that it is the responsibility of the school to have their own arrangements in place to manage poor attendance by offering appropriate support to parents and child.

If your child's attendance is unsatisfactory and not improving despite support from the school, the school will make a referral to the Local Authority. You may be invited to attend a PACE meeting (Police and Criminal Evidence Act 1984) or may proceed straight to Penalty Notice fine or prosecution.
