# This Week .....

## Anti Bullying Week

As it is anti-bullying week this week, the children have been taking part in activities to enhance their understanding of what bullying is.

Across the school, careful thought has been given to what bullying is: causing hurt, harm or humiliation to someone else (either physically, mentally or both) and that it needs to include **all** of the following 3 things:

**Repeated and takes place over a period of time.**

**Imbalance of power (being carried out by more than one person, or one person who is bigger or older, for example).**

**Deliberate!**

Mrs Munday delivered an assembly on Monday morning to reinforce this message with the children. Through considering scenarios, the children were able to think about situations that involve bullying and how to get 'RID' of bullying, as well as being able to make the distinction between these and unacceptable and unkind behaviour.

On Wednesday afternoon, classes participated in activities to enhance their understanding of anti-bullying, for example, producing poetry, exploring literature, creating anti-bullying posters, designing odd socks to celebrate difference and making friendship bracelets. A beautiful display of all the children's hard work will be created as a reminder to the children of the importance of what they learnt this week.

# Important Information

## Parking and walking to school

Unfortunately this week a car has been damaged outside the school due to parking. I would like to reiterate the importance of considerate parking for our neighbours, the safety of our children and your own vehicles. I appreciate that there is limited parking around the school, but would ask that you consider parking further away from the school and taking a small walk.

This would not only benefit the environment and congestion issue, but support all in keeping healthy and for well-being - think of all the lovely walks you took during the last lockdown and the benefits, including opportunities to observe the village, nature and time with your children.



## ParentPay

We have a number of parent accounts in debt for which we are having to chase payment on a daily basis at a cost to the school. Please can we ask for your co-operation in ensuring your child's Parent Pay account remains in credit at all times for school lunches. If your account is in arrears of more than £7, then we may request that your child brings in packed lunches until the account is in credit.

ParentPay can be set to automatically send you an email when your balance reaches a pre-set amount (choose communications and then alerts to set this to your chosen amount). For example, if you set the school meals' balance alert to £4.60 you will get an email 2 days before you need to add funds.

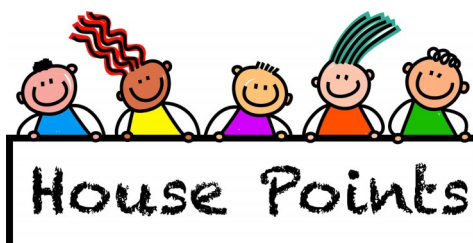


### Attendance
