Safer Internet Day Tuesday 9th February.

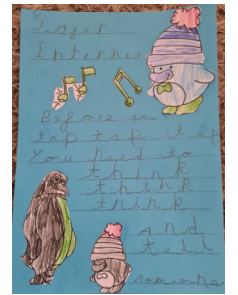
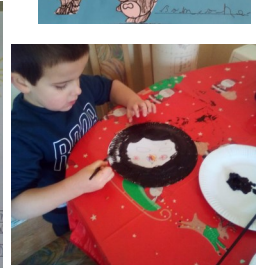
This Tuesday was Safer Internet Day which we observed in school through one of our live lessons and an activity in each class. Here is what we got up to:

The character in the power point was Smartie the penguin. We then had fun making Smartie the penguin masks, posters and colouring pictures of penguins.

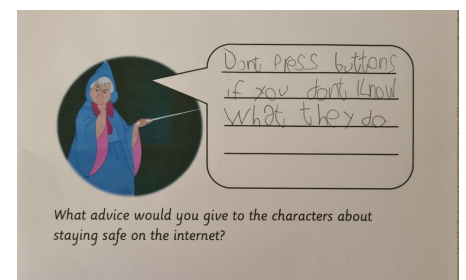
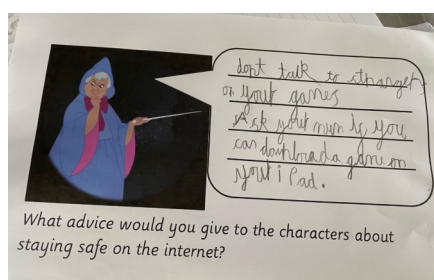
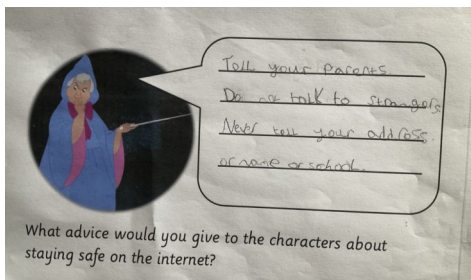
