Pupil Asset

We have moved over to a new system for holding information and recording assessments.

Going forward SMS and emails will be sent via this new system rather than ParentMail. When you receive SMS messages from school they will show as 'Beaupre CP' and emails will show from 'BeaupreCommunityPrimary@pupilasset.co.uk'. Attendance is expected for all children, however if your child is ill or has a medical condition that you have been advised by a medical professional that they should not attend due to Covid-19 then you must contact the school to inform us. Please send a picture of yourself wearing your character's face mask to your teacher


before 9am on Monday 8th March 2021.
