This week's Above and Beyond goes to Peter in Blue Class for always being polite and giving his best to his work and being an amazing friend to other children.






A very big well done to Harry in Yellow Class who after lots of hard work has been given a further 12 month contract with Peterborough United. Brilliant work, Harry!
