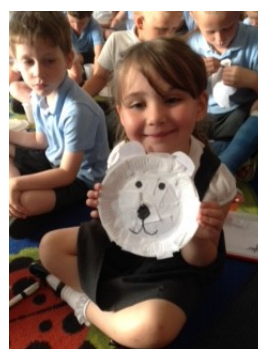
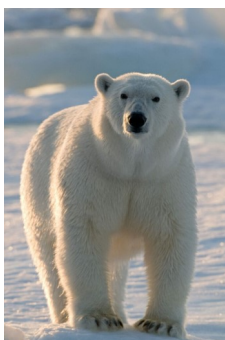


## Rainbow Class

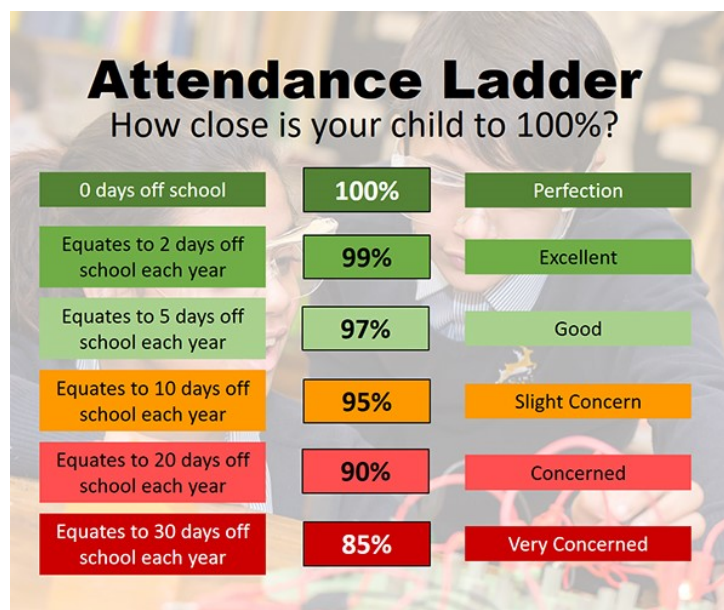

# Attendance

There are 190 school days in a year. This means that there are 175 other days in the year available to use for holidays. Every school day counts!

Children of school age who are registered at a school must, by law, attend that school regularly. When a child is absent from school, their learning is affected. They miss the lessons provided, and are less prepared for the lessons after their return to school. Absence also has a negative effect on social relationships and friendships.

Attendance is monitored daily and we create regular reports on individual attendance to monitor patterns and figures. Regular attendance is 96% (8 days absence throughout the academic year). Attendance below 94% may trigger intervention.



Please remember that if your child is unable to attend school for any reason it is important for parents to notify the school, by phone, **on each morning of an absence** to confirm why they will not be in. This important procedure is in place for safeguarding reasons. I am sure you would agree that it is important for everybody to know where the children should be, as soon as possible, on a daily basis.

Please be aware that if your child has 3 or more days' unauthorised absence within 4 weeks the school is expected to refer for a penalty notice. Parents are asked to submit absence forms to the school if they know in advance their children will be away for any reason. Along with all other schools in the Wisbech Schools' Partnership, we do not authorise absence for holidays in term-time.

## Lateness

Coming into school on time is also extremely important. Lateness can have a negative impact, being late may disrupt lessons, affect achievement, and embarrass or upset your child. Coming to school on time every day helps your child:

- To be ready for learning and not miss learning opportunities
- To settle into the day
- To get into good habits for the future, both in schooling and work

We have a breakfast club that starts at 8.00am, should you wish to use this facility please complete the survey which is emailed to all parents each week.

5 minutes late every day	3 days lost each year
10 minutes late everyday	6 days lost each year
15 minutes late every day	10 days lost each year
30 minutes late each day	19 days lost each year

If there are medical or other concerns that could be affecting your child's attendance please contact the school office to discuss this with us, working together can make a difference .
