We have some exciting news with regard to Reading at Beaupre!

Over the course of a set period (24 hours) children were encouraged to record everything that they read (their flow of reading). Examples included reading: books, magazines, signposts, writing on phones/electronic games/TV, food packets etc. Beaupre's teachers also took part, to reinforce these important reading messages to the children.

#### Attendance

Can we please remind you that if your child is not going to be in school for any reason, that you MUST contact the school every morning. The purpose is to record accurately their attendance, but most importantly so that we know where children are. We have had a number of cases where we have not been informed of why a child is off school and have been unable to make contact with parents via text, calls or emails. Our procedure in line with our policy for those that do not contact us is:

- Text parents/carers
- Email parents/carers
- Make phone calls to parents/carers
- Make phone calls to other contacts provided
- If we can not make contact, we will carry out a home visit. If no one is there we will leave a letter to ask you to make contact. If we do not hear following this, we will contact the police as a matter of a safeguarding concern.

#### **Football News**


