Foster Carers—Recruitment

Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Fostering Service is looking for foster carers to support children and young people. People who are empathetic, caring, resilient and open minded are needed.

Enquiries are welcomed from people who wish to foster for Cambridgeshire County Council or Peterborough City Council. Carers foster on a self-employed basis with allowances paid whilst a child/young person is in their care. This is an opportunity to support children and young people in your home while receiving support, training and development from the respective Local Authority.

The service offers:

- Generous mileage allowance, a setting up fee for furniture and equipment, two weeks' additional basic maintenance payments for holidays, birthdays allowance, a festivities allowance, initial clothing, and school uniform allowance.
- To help you feel reassured round the clock 'out of hours' support is provided should you need it.

A dedicated supervising social worker who will provide regular supervision and support.

There are lots of different types of fostering available for the right people and their families. Enthusiasm and commitment to support the needs of children and young people in care is needed as well as having a spare bedroom and being over 21. **There is an urgent need for people to help support teenagers, sibling groups and children with disabilities.**

Did you know - as a foster carer you could earn up to £44,720 + benefits for looking after 2 children who are 11+ subject to experience, training, and your assessment.

If you apply online by 31 October 2021 you will get an offer for a place on 1 March 2022 by email.

If you miss this deadline your child is much less likely to get a place at their preferred school.

Parent/Carer Contact and Permissions

Can we please remind you to keep the school updated with contact details, particularly if main contact numbers have changed. If you wish to add or remove contacts or update who can collect your child, could you please add these to an email and send to the school office.

ParentPay

We have a number of parent accounts which are in debt. We ask that you bring your account up to date, if you are having problems with Parentpay please contact the school office. Thank you.

If debts are not paid, we may ask for you to provide a packed lunch for your child until the balance is cleared or refuse for your child to attend Breakfast Club.

Attendance Matters

There are 190 school days in a year. This means that there are 175 other days in the year available to use for holidays. Every school day counts!

Children of school age who are registered at a school must, by law, attend that school regularly. When a child is absent from school, their learning is affected. They miss the lessons provided, and are less prepared for the lessons after their return to school. Absence also has a negative effect on social relationships and friendships.

We monitor attendance daily and we create regular reports on individual attendance to monitor patterns and figures. Letters are sent to parents to advise of attendance and lateness. If attendance continues to be a concern, parents will be invited to a meeting with Mrs Munday.

Please remember that if your child is unable to attend school for any reason it is important for parents to notify the school, by phone or email, **on each morning of an absence** to confirm why they will not be in. This important procedure is in place for safeguarding reasons. I am sure you would agree that it is important for everybody to know where the children should be, as soon as possible, on a daily basis.

You can notify us of your child's absence by telephoning or emailing the office, this should be done before 9.20am.

Children who arrive late will either be marked L or, if they arrive after registration closes, U. U is an unauthorised mark.

Please be aware that if your child has 3 or more days' unauthorised absence within 4 weeks the school is expected to refer for a penalty notice. Parents are asked to submit absence forms to the school if they know in advance their children will be away for any reason. Along with all other schools in the Wisbech Schools' Partnership, we do not authorise absence for holidays in term-time.
