Anti Bullying Week

As it is anti-bullying week, this week, the children have been taking part in activities to enhance their understanding of what bullying is.

Across the school, careful thought has been given to what bullying is: causing hurt, harm or humiliation to someone else (either physically, mentally or both) but it needs to include **all** of the following 3 things:

Repeated and takes place over a period of time.

mbalance of power (being carried out by more than one person, or one person who is bigger or older, for example).

Deliberate.

Mrs Summers delivered an assembly on Monday morning, to reinforce this message with the children, and through considering scenarios, the children were able to think about situations that involve bullying, and how to get '**RID**' of bullying! Mrs Summers also discussed making the distinction between RID and unacceptable and unkind behaviour.

Throughout the week, classes participated in activities to enhance their understanding of anti-bullying. For example; exploring literature, creating anti-bullying posters, designing odd socks to celebrate difference and making friendship bracelets and paper chains.

A beautiful display of all the children's hard work will be created, as a reminder to the children of the importance of what they learnt this week.






Yellow Class

Year 6 have been undertaking some wartime cookery which they took home to share with their families. Here is the recipe, should you wish to have a go at making it at home.

1916: What To Do With Cheese

Cheese And Lentil Savoury Recipe

Lentils are a highly nutritious as well as an economical food, and when treated as follows, they are also very delicious. Take eight ounces of cheese, five and a half ounces of lentils, three ounces of breadcrumbs, four ounces of onions, one and a half ounces of fat, parsley, salt and pepper.

Wash the lentils; peel and chop the onions and cook them in a little water with the lentils, stirring occasionally. Have the cheese grated; put it into a basin and when the lentils and onions have nearly finished cooking stir them to the cheese and add the breadcrumbs, a tablespoonful of chopped parsley and pepper and salt.



Handy hint: to convert ounces to grams: multiply by 28.35!
