ParentPay



We have several ParentPay accounts which are in debt, some of these have been outstanding for some time. We ask that you bring your account up to date and clear any outstanding amounts.

Please help us by making sure that you have sufficient funds on ParentPay for all bookings before school on that day. If your account is in arrears above £7.50, we may request that your child brings in packed lunches until the account is in credit.

ParentPay can be set to automatically send you an email when your balance reaches a pre-set amount (choose communications and then alerts to set this to your chosen amount). For example, if you set the school meals' balance alert to £4.60 you will get an email 2 days before you need to add funds.

This was my favourite book as a child, when I was about 10 years old. I loved sharing it with my daughter, when she was around a similar age and re-living it again.

It's about a girl called Margaret, for whom life isn't easy. She's moved house, is starting a new school and is finding making new friends tricky - and she's convinced she's not normal. For a start, she hasn't got a clue whether she wants to be Jewish like her father or Christian like her mother. She's got lots of concerns, but is too embarrassed to talk to her parents about what is worrying her, so instead she talks to God - and waits for His answer.

It inspired me to read lots more Judy Blume books. I can remember sneakily reading this book, when I should have been asleep! I can remember it being quite gripping to hear Margaret's most inner-thoughts and being able to relate to the things that she was worried about. The book is recommended for children in Upper KS2. I hope that you enjoy it, as much as I did.

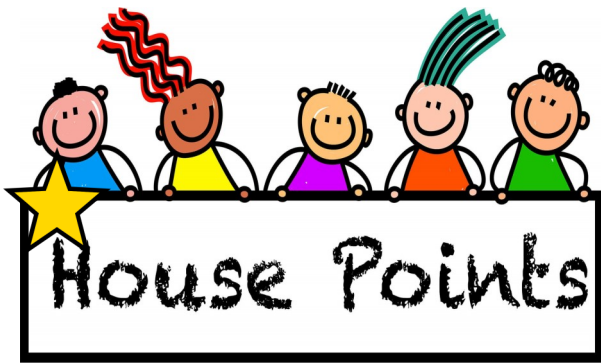
Our attendance figures for the week ending Friday 21st January are as follows:
