Wishing you all a wonderful weekend.



We will be sending home World Book Day Vouchers next week so that the children have them for half term.







This week, Mrs Munday, would like to share their treasured childhood book with you:

The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe, by C.S. Lewis

Growing up, as a child the book I remember the most was a story that grabbed my imagination, took me into another world and allowed me to think beyond the normal world into a magical one.

The Lion the Witch and the Wardrobe, follows four siblings, Peter, Edmund, Susan and Lucy, as they are evacuated from London during World War II and go on to live with a professor. To their surprise, the wardrobe in the professor's spare room is actually a portal to another world, Narnia.



Narnía has lived in winter for over one hundred years as all those there live in terror under the White Witch's reign. As the children enter the mysterious world through the wardrobe, they meet many characters including a Faun and Mr and Mrs Beaver. The children set off on a long and perilous journey to find Aslan - the King and Lord of Narnía. Together, the children join forces with Aslan's army against the heartless and wicked White Witch. The children each learn how they individually can help save Narnía. But will any of the children get enchanted by the wicked Queen and change sides?

World Religion Day 2022:

World Religion Day at Beaupre Community Primary School took place last Friday, 28th January. I was lucky enough to have a small glimpse into every classroom to see the wonderful, creative and engaging activities, which were taking place.

It was delightful to see how far the children have come in developing their knowledge of the 6 main religions of the world and the enthusiastic conversations I had with the children certainly emphasised this. Please do ask your children as to which religion they were learning about and what they learnt, as their vocabulary and cross-curricular links to Maths, Art and Design, as well as, History and Geography really blew me away!

Rainbow had been learning about Sikhism, creating their own 'Gurus' which they were able to explain meant 'Teacher'. Red Class were building Hindu temples from geometric blokes and were discussing that a temple is a place Hindus visit to pray. Blue Class were learning about Christianity and developed their knowledge of Christian symbols and created their own stained glass windows. Purple Class learnt about the religion of Islam and decorated jars to represent and symbolise the Islamic festival of Eid. Green Class were learning about Buddhism and created flags including Buddhist symbols and a prayer they had written using the core Buddhist beliefs. Orange Class explored Hinduism linked to our Geography topic of the Indus Valley, we sampled various Hindu cuisine including poppadums' and chutneys. We created Hindu gods from felt and lanterns to symbolise the Diwali festival of light. Similarly Yellow Class also made cross-curricular links to

History and Geography linked with their current learning of WW2. The children were learning about Judaism and created Dreidols using

chocolate and marshmallows.

Overall the children said they had a wonderful day and it certainly supported their religious knowledge and understanding.
