Welcome to this week's newsletter. There has been lots happening this week across the school.

Whilst being on the school gate, I have seen a variety of very detailed and creative model mountains arrive. It's been a pleasure to see how the children are engaged in their learning and continuing it at home with their homework.



This week has been Children's Mental Health Week, where we began with an assembly on growing not just physically but emotionally. We discussed how we all have good and bad days, where some days and times we grow lots emotionally and other times not so much. We talked about how this was ok and how we can support each other through the good and not so good times. Each class has participated in activities to support mental health and wellbeing.

On Wednesday, the children participated in Safer Internet Day. Miss Brand began the day with a whole school assembly to share the importance of staying safe on line. This is an area that, as schools and parents, we need to be very vigilant of, particularly as younger children are using games, phones and tablets to engage with others. Please can I take this opportunity to remind you about the age restrictions on games and social media apps. I appreciate the pressures our children have from others to engage with these, but the age-restrictions are there to protect your children from online abuse, being subjected to material that is not age-appropriate and unfortunately, potentially putting them in a situation that we would not be wanting our children to be exposed to off-line. Our role as adults is to protect our children and I would urge that you are vigilant to what they are using their devices for.





Beaupre's Children's Mental Health Week

This week, was Children's Mental Health Week; this year's theme was Growing Together. After Monday's assembly by Mrs Munday regarding children's mental growth, all of the children at Beaupre have had the opportunity to partake in activities to explore how they have grown emotionally and how they can work together to support each other mentally. A range of exciting activities took place across the school, ranging from: exploring uplifting song lyrics, creating and narrating poems, making support balloons and stress balls, exploring the mental benefits of physical exercise, considering practical solutions to help to deal with worries and anyieties and even creating cress monsters! Rainbow Class



On Monday, Rainbow Class talked about Children's Mental Health Week. We spent the afternoon discussing how we change and grow. We all made a little cress monster to look after. We watered the seeds and now we will wait and watch them grow.

Red Class

On Tuesday, the children in Red Class took part in activities related to Children's Mental Health Week. We discussed different feelings and emotions and how it is ok to feel a variety of different emotions. The children made stress balls from flour filled balloons and were able to take part in other activities such as considering what makes them unique.



In Blue Class, we took part in a mindfulness yoga session. This included a story about an owlet, with yoga poses to go along with the story. We practiced

different poses including the tree, supported each other with encouraging words and took time to relax and just breath.

Following this session, we took some time to think positively about ourselves and encourage our selfesteem. We drew pictures of ourselves in a mirror and surrounded the picture with positive words about our strengths.

Purple Class

On Monday, Purple Class undertook their activities. The first thing that they did was to create support balloons, discussing who supports us and how they have helped us grow.

Then for the second activity, the children listened to the story of The Ugly Duckling and discussed the story of how the swan changed and grew and how he felt. The children then in the outline of a swan drew or wrote things that they can now do after they have grown.

Green Class

Fortunately Wellbeing Week has fitted in nicely with our Mountain homework being returned, so we were able to share cake from some of the homeworks as we sat and socialised. Talking together, face to face with real people is very important for us. Sharing also helps us to feel that we have friends and are appreciated and grows our friendships. Our Chinese traditional story unit has come to an end in English so we were able to relax and enjoy watching how Disney interpreted the story of Mulan, comparing it to the story that we had read last week. Finding the right balance of work and leisure time is important in maintaining a healthy lifestyle, if you can combine the two then that's even better.

On Friday afternoon we will think about the things that make us feel happy, that we enjoy and think about how we might be able to grow that side of things as we get older. Then we will be going out for some Tag Rugby – team games are good ways to grow skills and friendships...and it is PE day too.






Orange Class

During the afternoon of Monday 7th February 2022, Orange Class dedicated their afternoon to the teaching and learning of 'Growing Together' in support of Mental Health Week. The children discussed the differences between positive and negative emotions and who can be responsible for these emotions, as well as, the impact of our feelings on our emotional wellbeing and who is available to support us during times of joy or struggles. We completed some therapeutic colouring activities to provide an outlet of relieving tensions and formulated a list of activities and strategies we can use to support ours and other people's well-being including poetry writing and puzzles. Further discussions were had as to 'Growing Together' and what constitutes the term 'together'. The children created an Orange Class Team flag, emphasising all the characteristics we require to support our team and develop our emotional growth.

Yellow Class

In Yellow Class, the children confidentially considered their worries, which they placed in a case. Subsequently, the children vowed to help others in the class to 'hold their worries'. We then grouped the worries into those that are: hypothetical, those that have a practical solution or those that might not be able to be solved but would benefit from the support of someone helping them to hold those worries. Afterwards, the children explored the supportive and hopeful lyrics of 'You'll Never Walk Alone'. The individual lyrics were distributed between members of the class who wrote this word in a style of choice with hopeful illustrations. Afterwards, photographs of the children and their words were ordered and used to create inspirational bunting, which is currently on display outside Mrs Munday's office. A video performance of Yellow Class's inspirational message was recorded.

Thank you to everyone involved in their construction, they are truly spectacular.








Old but Gold

R.L.Stine's 'Goosebumps'

As a child, the collection of books that always captivated my imagination and left me yearning for more was R.L.Stine's 'Goosebumps', but not just any of the series of books, but 'Night of the Living Dummy 2'. I can remember my Grandfather buying it for me, at my school book fayre, at the end of school on a Friday afternoon, before he took me to London for the weekend for some quality time with him and my Nanny. Although I didn't end up spending much



time with them, as once I had opened the book and began reading, I simply couldn't put it down. I stayed awake until 2:00am, as I was DESPERATE to find out if the evil dummy - Slappy, and his menacing ways - would come to an end. What I most enjoyed, was how the text left the reading on a cliffhanger, wondering if what you thought had happened, really had taken place. R.L.Stine's choice of language kept me completely absorbed and I felt as though I was frightfully living through the events of the story.
