To mark the 25th anniversary of World Book Day, Beaupre decided to explore reasons to read with the intention of finding their top 25 reasons! Narrowing down of the list was an extremely difficult task. Such reasons - and they are not in order of priority, as all of these suggestions as to why reading is so important - are of equal Value!

- It makes you think!
- To expand our depth and breadth of VoCabulary.
- To support our spelling through Viewing words by sight.
- 4. To develop our imagination and Creativity.
- To instruct us on how to Create something.
- 6. To inform us of Current events and issues, so that we are all informed of what is going on in our/the world!
- To empathise and identify with CharaCters and to be able to relate our reading to our own real life situations.
- 8. To keep us safe when on the road, or most situations in fact, and to inform us of hazards: it's important to be able to read the 'mind the step' sign!!
- To View food Choices on a restaurant/takeaway menu (essential)!
- To gain knowledge about an aspect of interest, for example, information texts.
- To be able to access films which require subtitles.
- 12. To esCape reality and be somewhere and someone else for a time reading provides the opportunity to imagine yourself as someone else, in a new world!
- 13. To help you to relax which, in turn, will support your well-being and will help you to Calm down, when needed; reading Can even help you to fall asleep! (better than Counting sheep)!
- 14. To meet new CharaCters: new friends.
- 15. To be able to excitedly discuss and share your love of books/what you've just read with others.
- To grow your imagination and inspire you.
- To take your mind off your worries and to just 'shut off' when you want to.
- 18. To enhance your progress at school by helping you to be successful in other subjects where reading is required.
- 19. To help you with the pronunciation of words particularly new words.
- 20. To help you to express your emotions with new VoCabulary.
- To get you off teChnology!!!
- 22. The more you read, the better reader you become!
- 23. The more experienced, as a reader, you become is reflected in an improvement in your ability as a writer.
- 24. To be able to read and understand the Interactive Whiteboard in Class.
- 25. To be able to re-read what we have written, to allow us to share with other people our stories and reCorded ideas and opinions with passion and enthusiasm!




Comic Relief 2022


