Attendance

What sort of start is your child getting? Just a little bit late doesn't seem much but...

They are only missing just	That equals	Which is	Over 13 years of schooling that's

Did you know your child's best learning time is the start of the school day?

That's when every minute counts the most!

School starts at 8:40am

Can we please remind you that if your child is not going to be in school for any reason, you MUST contact the school every morning. The purpose is to record accurately their attendance, but most importantly so that we know where children are. We have had a number of cases where we have not been informed of why a child is off school and have been unable to make contact with parents via text, calls or emails. Our procedure, in line with our policy for those that do not contact us is:

- Text parents/carers
- Email parents/carers
- Make phone calls to parents/carers
- Make phone calls to other contacts provided
- If we can not make contact, we may carry out a home visit. If no one is there we will leave a letter to ask you to make contact. If we do not hear following this, we will contact the police as a matter of a safeguarding concern.

If your child is unwell we will ask for the type of illness they have to ensure we have their attendance record marked correctly. Not all illnesses require your child to be kept off school. Please see the NHS link below which gives guidance on timescales children should be kept at home for different illnesses.

Term Time Leave Absences

If you know your child will be absent from school, we request that you complete a notification of absence form. These are available from the school office. Any leave of absence requests will be considered by the Headteacher and will be looked at individually, however the Government has removed the discretion on Headteachers to agreeing term time leave, therefore you are strongly urged to avoid booking family holidays during term time.

Any absences where a request is not received but evidence suggests your child has been on holiday will result in a suspected holiday letter being sent, this will ask for a reason and evidence for the absence.

Any unauthorised leave of absence could result in a Penalty Notice fine being issued. Penalty fines are £120 (reducing to £60 if paid within 21 days) per child, per adult. Non payment of fines will result in a case being listed for prosecution in the Magistrates Court, without further warning being issued.

Year 2 will be carrying out their 'Quizzes/Tests' during week commencing 16th May, with Key Stage 1 children carrying out Phonics checks in the week commencing 6th June.

Year 4 children will taking part in Multiplication Table Checks between 6th and 24th June.


