## Collaborative Learning Opportunity - Years 5 and 6 - Crime Solving

Years 5 and 6 have had an incredibly exciting week with their learning! The police have been in attendance twice! On Monday, Years 5 and 6 commenced a collaborative unit of work based on the disappearance of the school's caretaker! The children were asked by Denise's 'husband'to help to discover her whereabouts following her not returning from work on Monday morning. Mr Dawe also expressed his concern at finding her treasured duster at the bottom of the school field! The children used the information provided by Mr Cochrane to produce missing posters and victim profiles for Denise. PC Wise briefly visited and asked the children to find as much information as they could, whilst he made preliminary enquiries.
