Rainbow - Cooking

This half term Rainbow Class have been talking about their family and the things they like to do together. We talked about our favourite food and Mrs Eaves shared a shortbread recipe that her Nan use to cook with her. All the adults in the class brought in cookery books from home and we enjoyed looking at them together. Mr H and Mrs Vickers then helped the children make shortbread biscuits. But, the best bit was eating them while they were still warm. Delicious!

Nan's Shortbread Biscuits

150g Castor Sugar
300g Salted Butter
400g Plain Flour
50g Corn Flour

1. Line baking tray with greaseproof paper
2. Cream butter and sugar together
3. Sift flour and cornflour
4. Mix flour with butter mixture
5. Form a dough butter mixture
6. Roll or press until 1cm thick, cut into shapes
7. Bake 10-15 minutes 160°C / Gas 3




Blue Class

Last Friday, Blue Class enjoyed making Challah bread which is a plaited, Jewish bread, baked to celebrate Shabbat and other festivals. The children worked in groups to make the dough and then plaited their own loaves. In the afternoon, the children got to sample their bakes and it was a thumbs up from the vast majority! I've attached the recipe here if you would like to have a go at making it at home.

Challah Bread



Ingredients

- 125ml lukewarm water
- 3.5g dry active yeast
- $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon honey
- $\frac{1}{2}$ dessert spoon honey
- 285g plain flour (plus extra for dusting the work surface)
- Pinch of salt
- 3 large eggs
- Vegetable oil

A Jewish bread eaten on the Sabbath - a holy day of rest and celebration for Jewish people. The Sabbath begins at nightfall on Friday and lasts until nightfall on Saturday.

Equipment

- Weighing scales
- Large mixing bowl
- Measuring jug
- 2 clean tea towels
- 2 bowls
- Knife and fork
- Wooden spoon
- Pastry brush
- Baking paper and baking tray


Method

First wash your hands and put on an apron. Ask an adult to sanitise the work surface. Remember to wash your hands after handling raw egg and yeast.

- 1 Pour the warm water into the jug.
- 2 Add the yeast and $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon of honey to the water.
- 3 Cover the jug with a tea towel and leave to one side.
- 4 Crack two eggs into a bowl. Add $\frac{1}{2}$ dessert spoon of honey, a pinch of salt and whisk with a fork.
- 5 Check your yeast mixture. Once it has gone bubbly, add it to the plain flour in a large mixing bowl.
- 6 Add the egg mixture and mix with the wooden spoon until a dough is formed.

Method

- 7 Tip the dough onto a floured surface and knead until smooth.
- 8 Brush the large bowl with the oil and then put the dough in the bowl. Cover with a clean tea towel and leave it to rise in a warm place until it has doubled in size.
- 9 Once the dough has risen, dust the work surface with flour. Then, knead the bread again to remove the air.
- 10 Roll the dough into a thick sausage and then cut into three equal pieces.
- 11 Roll each piece into a thin sausage and then plait the three pieces - you may need an adult to help with this bit. Tuck both ends underneath the loaf to round the ends off neatly.
- 12 Place the dough on the baking paper and put this on a baking tray.
- 13 Crack the last egg into a bowl and use the pastry brush to coat the dough with egg wash. Don't add too much or the dough will become too wet and soggy.
- 14 Ask an adult to put the dough in the oven. It needs to go in at 180° (gas mark 6) for 25-30 minutes.
- 15 An adult must remove the bread from the oven. Let it cool before eating.
- 16 Enjoy!

Writing in Purple Class



Year 3 have just finished their first topic in writing: first person narrative descriptions. They explored the model text and its theme, which was a haunted / gothic building and then looked at the structure and key vocabulary it used before coming up with their own ideas.

To gain inspiration, they explored different types of fruit and created wordbanks of amazing adjectives that they could include in their own writing and then visited the local church to gain even more ideas for their 'haunted' writing. The ideas and enthusiasm in the church were overwhelming!

The final pieces were then planned and written, all based on entering a haunted church on their own and something strange happening. The writing produced was exceptional and everyone did themselves proud. All pieces of writing have been included in a class book in the library for everyone to read and a couple of examples have been sent to be displayed in the church.




The winner of the 100% attendance prize for week ending Friday 15th September is Lexi WC in Rainbow Class!
