

The theme was Thali Harvest and Rayeeta, the special guest Indian chef, cooked Palak Paneer. Before the lesson we tasted some of the ingredients that the presenters were going to use in a recipe. We tasted chives, spinach, ginger biscuits and paneer cheese. We discussed, as a class, what each item looked like, smelt like, how it felt and what it tasted like. We submitted lots of question and Lexi P's question was read out on live TV and our school got a mention. "How do you become a farmer?" We were told that you could start working at the weekends on a farm and you could even do a farming course at college or university. We followed the life cycle of onions and spinach and were shown round a dairy farm to see all the robots used in modern dairy farming.
