

YELLOW CLASS AUTUMN A 2023

Yellow Class commenced their English work, by linking their writing to Roles and Responsibilities that they would be able to embrace given their newly-found Year 6 status! Initially, the children undertook peer mediation training and were given the opportunity to formally apply to become a peer mediator this year. Additionally, the children looked at the skills and qualities that would make them a good House Captain. They used this acquired knowledge to produce manifestos to share with the rest of their House where voting took place and this year's House Captains were selected.

Beaupre's Year 5 and 6 spent a week collaboratively learning - with the theme being based

around MacMillan and the support that they provide for families coping with Cancer. They commenced this opportunity by researching MacMillan Cancer Support together and were able to produce information leaflets all about this charity. On Tuesday 3rd October Years 5 and 6 hosted a MacMillan Coffee morning where children were able to share their knowledge about MacMillan and the vital work that they do with visitors, as well as enjoying cakes and biscuits and most importantly making lots of money for this crucial charity. Following this, the children completed a charity run for MacMillan, where they ran, jogged or walked around the school field (6 times) to raise even more money for MacMillan. Further learning opportunities involved creating diary entries, considering Cancer survivors' testimonials, as well as producing news report videos and newspaper articles about their thought-provoking week of learning. This was followed by a representative from Queen Elizabeth Hospital in Kings Lynn kindly agreeing to come and give a

talk to Years 5 and 6 to further embed their learning about and under-

standing of Cancer.



October was Black History Month in the UK. As such, the children took part in a social segregation experiment to allow them to write in the voice of a black maid who was experiencing racial discrimination. They also explored the lives of inspirational black people who've helped change the face of racism.

We've loved our Art lessons with Mrs Calver this half-term, where we've worked towards producing portraits. Can you recognise anyone? WW2 Day - On Thursday 12th October, Yellow Class had the opportunity to take part in a WW2 day to enhance their History topic. The children spent the morning, making gas masks, taking part in air raids, learning WW2 songs and cooking (Spam sandwiches also made an appearance) with an online interactive history zoom workshop on WW2 in the afternoon, where original artefacts were shared and stories and activities took place.
