

Information for Landlords and Tenants

Information for landlords

Being a private landlord can be challenging, but support and information are available online (search: 'UK landlord guidance'), or phone 0800 131 6400.

Information for tenants

For rented property, a landlord has a legal duty to provide tenants with a copy of the Energy Performance Certificate (EPC).

The EPC of a private rented property, should, by law, be A B C D or E. If a property is rated F or G, the landlord is obliged to improve its EPC rating. Should the landlord refuse to do anything to stop the heat loss, the tenant has a right to report them to the Borough Council.

It is one thing that you can do to help us get clean, cheaper energy.



Energy Saving Ideas!

- Leaving things on standby could save up to £65 a year.
- Thick rugs and curtains keep warmth in and draughts out.
- If curtains hang in front of radiators, they block heat.
- Draught excluders for internal doors can be made by stuffing some old tights.
- Extra insulation to your hot water tank (£16 for a tank jacket) could save up to £70 a year.
- Using your heating when you need it is cheaper than running it all the time on a low setting.
- A tumble dryer is an energy guzzler!
- Washing your clothes at 30°C is fine, but towels and bedding need a higher temperature.
