Green Class at West Stow Anglo-Saxon Village

As Green Class has been studying Britain after the Romans left, Year 4 have been finding out more about the Anglo-Saxons and how they lived. So the whole class headed over to West Stow in Suffolk to have a look at some reconstructed Anglo-Saxon houses for themselves.

On arriving, we headed straight to the village. The buildings have been created to test theories about house building based on the remains of the old village, so each house is slightly different. They were marked with runes on the doors. We enjoyed going inside to explore and some of us even tried out the beds which weren't like the ones that we are used to at all! Some of us were a bit put off by the smoky smells and animal skins though.

Once we'd had a good look round, we met around the fire in the rather smoky Great Hall for the telling of the story of Beowulf by Stephanie, an archaeologist who has tested all the houses by sleeping in them and looks after the pigs. It was a great story, and very violent!!

After lunch we visited the site museum, looking at some of the archaeological finds from the original village and having the chance to handle some of the artefacts to find out more about them. We were able to try on a replica of the Sutton Hoo helmet, which was very heavy and would have been difficult to fight in. Some of us also found the dressing up clothes and investigated what we might have looked like as Anglo-Saxons.

The children explored enthusiastically and came up with plenty of very good questions throughout the day. Thank you to Mr Swann for joining us and making the day less fraught for Miss Bagg, Mrs Bingham and myself.

It was a very full day, we learnt a lot and certainly had plenty to think about. It was also exciting to see and explore the actual houses that we have been seeing pictures of and learning about during our topic work.















This week was another cold day for the woodland sessions, but everyone kept busy and warm! Years 1 and 5 had the privilege of using our wonderful area and participated in some of the wonderful activities on offer. We also had many parents come and join in with the fun again.

The activities for the day included:

Making bird pizzas using mud, meal worms, seeds and dried fruit. These were then taken home in Eco-friendly bags made from recycled newspaper. Exploring and making sculptures using Christmas playdough and other natural items found in the woodland.

Making Christmas trees using twigs to make the perfect triangular shape .

Bird watching.

Making hot chocolate creations with vinegar and bicarbonate of soda so that chemical reactions happened.

Making hedgehog homes.

Tree climbing

Making lanterns with tins, hammers and nails.

This year we are performing a Boogie, Woogie Nativity and are pleased to invite parents/carers to join us on:-




