BLUE CLASS HAVE ENJOYED A MORNING WOODLAND SESSION IN THE FOREST AREA. WE STARTED THE SESSION WITH A LEAF HUNT IN WHICH WE FOUND LARGE, MEDIUM AND SMALL LEAVES AND SORTED THEM ACCORDINGLY.

THEN WE EXPLORED A RANGE OF ACTIVITIES INCLUDING MAKING PAINT BRUSHES WITH NATURAL MATERIALS HELD TOGETHER WITH AN ELASTIC BAND.

THEY ALSO PRINTED USING VEGETABLES AND LEAVES. THEY USED CHALK AND SPOONS TO DIG OUT SECTIONS OF A POTATO WHICH THEY THEN USED AS A PRINTING BLOCK.

SOME CHILDREN WERE ALSO INSPIRED BY OTHER CRAFTS THAT THEY SAW HANGING IN THE FOREST AND DECIDED TO MAKE HANGING SHAPES USING STICKS AND ELASTIC BANDS. THE CHILDREN ALSO ENJOYED USING THE WOODEN PLANKS AS SEESAWS AND USING STICKS IN IMAGINATIVE PLAY.

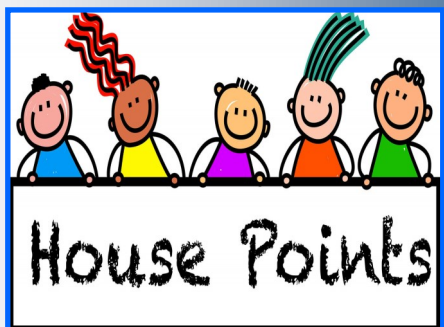
