

World Book Day 2024

To celebrate World Book Day at Beaupre, the day started with an exciting assembly. After exploring all of the wonderful book character costumes that the children and staff came to school in, each class represented their house in a competition based on book trivia, missing characters, book settings and picture clues. Children worked together in their houses as a whole team against a team of adults – made up of representatives from each class. Questions were carefully tailored for the adult's and children's teams and, although it was very close, the children won with 29 points (2 more points than the adult team).

Parents were invited to join reading cafes in their children's classes and had the opportunity to experience reading for pleasure and to participate in fun learning activities in classes with their children. During the afternoon, teachers swapped classes and shared some of their favourite books with their 'new' class. The day was rounded off with story time in each class. A brilliant time was had by all and the message that reading is fun was certainly heard loudly at Beaupre.

Blue Class

Blue Class enjoyed a morning of activities based around Charlie and the Chocolate Factory. After the whole school assembly and book quiz, we welcomed parents in to the classroom to hear a short passage from the book which described Mr Willy Wonka's weird and wonderful chocolate creations. We then enjoyed using craft materials to make our own sweet inventions including various twisted lolly pops, candy canes and spiral sugar creations. We also used scented playdough, glitter and straws to make chocolates, toffees and cupcakes.

In the kitchen, the children used real melted chocolate, sprinkles, popping candy, marshmallows and biscuit crumbs to make their own chocolate bark which we look forward to trying tomorrow, once it has set in the fridge. In the afternoon, we set off for our first swimming lesson. It has been a fun filled day for all in Blue Class!















Orange Class

Orange Class had a wonderful day, their costumes from iconic characters was brilliant! Well done to all those, who took part.

Orange Class thoroughly enjoyed World Book Day. We created our own book reviews from a range of our favourite books, which we hope will be shared in the school library.

During the day, we immersed ourselves in our class read 'The boy in the tower' by Polly Ho-Yen. We designed our own apocalyptic inspired monsters and characters, who would feature in our own interpretation of the text.

We created mood boards to retell our inspired version of the text and engaged in a variety of reading comprehensions.

We enjoyed a whole school read and all the teachers reading with the different classes, thank you Miss Knight.

We created our own class quiz and created a graphic novel comic strip from famous texts, as well as entered the class competition creating a mixed up character.

Yellow Class

To start the session, the children listened to the traditional fairytale 'The Three Little Pigs' which was followed by Roald Dahl's revolting rhyme about Little Red Riding Hood. Thank you to parents/grandparents who attended our reading café and enjoyed sharing these. The children used these stories to consider really distinguishable features of characters to help them to create three fairytale characters for a muddle books. This created much amusement when Rapunzel had the feet of a pig and was wearing Little Red Riding Hood's cloak. The class look forward to sharing these with Rainbow Class.

After this, the children worked in pairs to create their own revolting rhymes based on fairytale characters, which brought much hilarity when being shared.

After lunch, the children enjoyed a mystery reader – Miss Bagg – who shared Dr Seuss stories. They then took a scene from a book of choice to create a scene to portray in a graphic novel.

Green Class

The children all arrived very excited, a multi-coloured procession of fiction and non-fiction book types filled the classroom, many taking on the role of their chosen character.

We started with the World Book Day assembly, before coming back to the classroom where we were fortunate enough to have parents join us for activities based on "The Firework-maker's Daughter" by Philip Pullman. Options included making our own firework; graffiti-ing Hamlet, the white elephant; creating a menu for "Rambashi's Bar and Grill" and designing a poster for the great international firework competition.

In the afternoon the class was visited by a mystery reader (Mrs Munday) who read an extract of one of her favourite books and reminded us just how many books Julia Donaldson has written.

The rest of the afternoon was used to create our own graphic novel for a story that we know well. We looked at Asterix and Tintin to see how the frames worked before working on our own. We tried a range of stories from Alice In Wonderland and Harry Potter to Stick Man and Jack and the Beanstalk.





Red Class

Red Class had an enjoyable World Book Day, in their fantastic costumes, based around fairy tales. During the course of the day, the children enjoyed making book marks, reading different stories, writing about their costumes and why they chose them and other fairy tale related crafts. The class also enjoyed a surprise appearance from Mr Davies in the afternoon, who very kindly read them a story. Many children enjoyed the company of Ursula, the sea witch, and wanted her to steal their voices – luckily, Ursula was very kind and let them keep their voices!





Purple Class

After Mrs Summers' World Book day assembly, the children came back to the classroom and listened to the book 'Oh the places you will go' by Dr Seuss. From the book the children were asked to design their own balloon using a variety of different materials. At the bottom, the children were able to record what they want to be when they grow up or where they want to go in the round. After that, the children were able to make and design their own Cat in the Hat book mark. After lunch, Purple Class were read 'One Fish Two Fish Red Fish Blue Fish' by Miss Bagg and after that Mrs Summers came in to read them a different story. To end the day, the children were able to create some wonderful graphic novels for a story that they know or have read before. Mrs Maryon and I have thoroughly enjoyed World Book Day with all of the class, especially seeing their excitement throughout the day.







Rainbow Class



During whole school assembly, led by Mr Summers, everyone had the chance to show off their amazing costumes and participate in the school Book Quiz 2024.

After this, many of the children's parents and carers visited Rainbow Class and we were all very excited to welcome them and let them join in with our learning. Our theme was the Hungry Caterpillar story, which Mrs Eaves read to the class. We then had many activities set up for everyone to join in with. These included: making a caterpillar out of egg boxes which could be painted, a stained glass window butterfly, fruit kebabs using all the fruit types mentioned in the story, designing butterfly wings, a butterfly number bond activity and a literacy activity where the children had to write a sentence describing what they would do if they were a butterfly.

After break, we made butterflies and caterpillars out of playdough and read some books about butterflies.

In the afternoon, we were treated to a story read by Mrs Connell called 'A Tiny Seed' by Eric Carle. We had some time to learn a new song, 'Once I saw Butterfly' and sang it to some of the adults in school. Everyone was pleased that our afternoon fruit snack was supplemented with all the left over fruit from our morning kebabs. After that, Rainbow Class created their own version of 'The Hungry Caterpillar', in the style of a graphic novel. This is now proudly on display in the classroom to remind us what a fantastic, fun filled day we had.

We finished the day listening to Mrs Eaves reading some of the books the children had brought from home.


Now, Writing for Pleasure is being promoted by English experts, with the intention of building a community of writers and giving children the opportunity to read, share and talk about their writing.

So.... this year's World Book Day whole school competition is for you to recognise that you all have the potential to be authors and that everything that you write is important, you are developing writing preferences and it is a skill that you constantly practise.

Over the course of a set period (24 hours) you will need to record everything that you write (your flow of writing). Examples include writing: in homework, a 'to do' list, a letter to someone, inside a card, a shopping list, text messages or into internet search engines.

There will be a prize for 1st, 2nd and 3rd prize from across the school.



We suggest that you open the email and follow the instructions to set up an account with Pupil Asset, **using the email address that we hold for you**. You will be asked to set your own password.

After you have registered, you can book your appointment using the account details you have set up. The Parent Portal can be found: secure.pupilasset.com

There is a Pupil Asset App which Can be download from Google Play or IOS App Store. It is called the Pupil Asset Parent App - this is a free app. Usually, once you have the app, you can log on using the email address and password you have set, however at present the app is being worked on and is not allowing Parent Evening bookings.

If you have not received an email or have any problems please contact the school office.

The portal and app also allows you to update your personal details, such as address and telephone updates.


