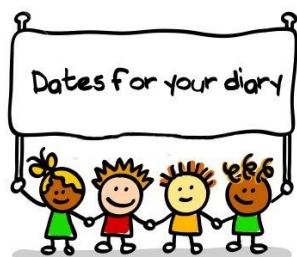
## Sweet Cones
