Burritos Original Recipe

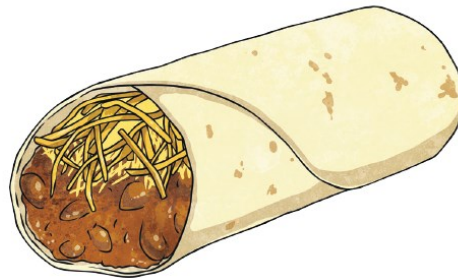
Ingredients:

- 2 cups of refried beans, warmed
- 6 extra-large, burrito-sized flour tortillas, warmed
- 2 cups of shredded Mexican-style cheese
- 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ cups of sour cream

Directions:

1. Place $\frac{1}{3}$ cup of beans in the center of the tortilla.
2. Place $\frac{1}{3}$ cup of cheese in the center of the tortilla.
3. Roll up the sides of the burrito to cover the beans and cheese.
4. Roll up the burrito to enclose the beans and cheese.
5. Repeat for the remaining beans, cheese, and tortillas.
6. Serve with sour cream.

Collaborative Learning – Elder Class and Oak Class

On 11th November 2024, Years 5 and 6 were given the opportunity to work collaboratively around the theme of remembrance. To start the day's learning, the children created their own poppies, which they were able to wear during a visit to our village's war memorial. The children were all very empathetic, reflective and represented themselves very maturely. They were able to think about the soldiers who died in the First World War (and the Second World War); considering local surnames, soldiers who were related and dates when the soldiers died. On return to the classroom, the children explored the Roll of Honour for Outwell and found out more information about these heroes.

Following this, the children explored a number of WW1 poems and were able to consider the impact of emotive language and poetic techniques. They were then tasked with creating their own war poems. We hope that you enjoy sharing their impressive efforts.

The following day, the children's learning around this topic was embedded further, by - still working collaboratively - learning, reciting and performing famous war poems from WW1.

Oak Class

For Anti-bullying week Oak Class, created a word bank of words and feelings around bullying. We used our knowledge and creativity to produce some Anti-bullying art work to express our ideas. Following that, we formed an acrostic poem around 'Respect' and concluded our learning to complete a reading comprehension.

Chestnut Class

This week has been Anti Bullying Week and Chestnut Class had a really engaging afternoon learning about 'Friendship'. We had a discussion about what we thought made a good friend. Then Mrs Eaves showed the class a short film in which children explaining, in their own words, what they thought made a good friend.

There was a carousel of activities which included: hand printing to make a friendship circle, colouring a paper man who was made up of various friendship qualities, matching pictures of children doing various things and deciding whether they were kind or unkind actions and a photo booth so everyone could be photographed in order to make a class Anti-Bullying poster. We finished the afternoon listening to the story 'Bad Apple' a story of friendship by Edward Hemingway.





Last Friday, Oak Class thoroughly enjoyed taking their learning outside into the woodland area. The children engaged in a variety of activities such as creating woodland bonfire inspired art, den building, free play and exploration, bug hunting, building bug hotels and pond dipping.

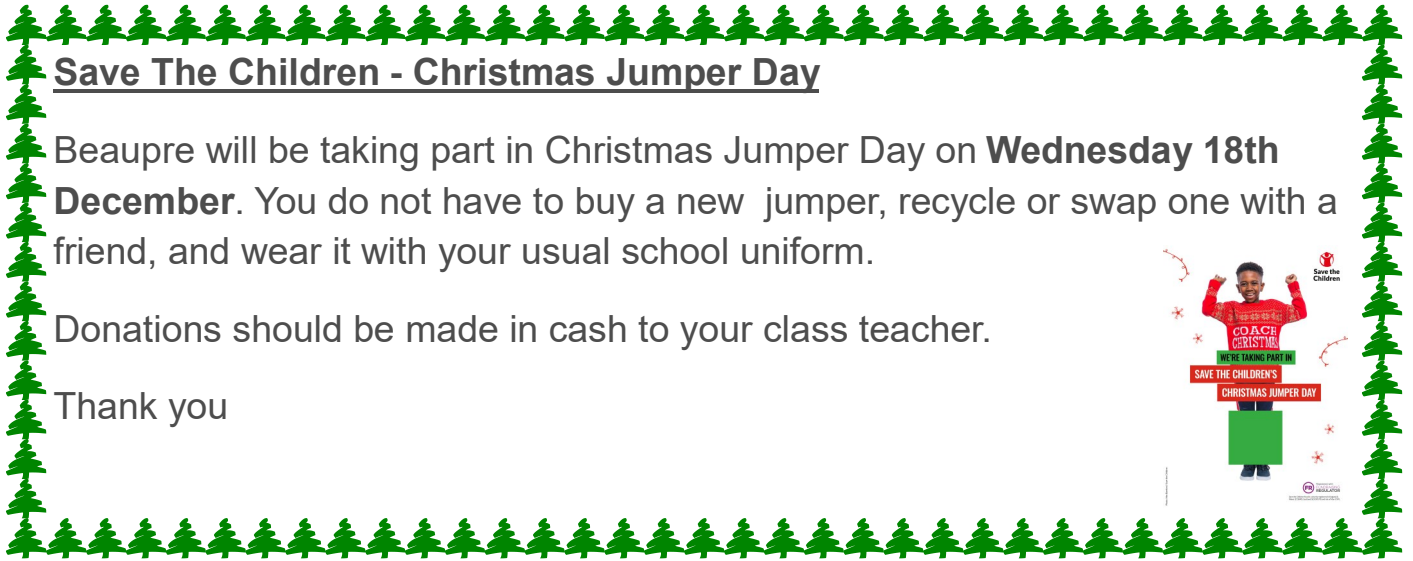
