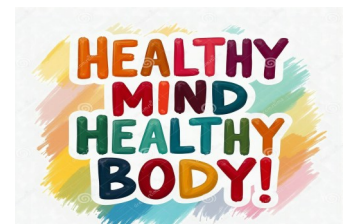
Welcome to this week's newsletter.

OUR WONDERFUL WOODLAND!

Recently, our Year 3's spent an afternoon in our wonderful woodland. During their time, they had so many opportunities to explore, create and work together. During this VERY cold session, the children:

- Were set a challenge in teams to create an obstacle course for an ant, using only natural resources. Their ideas were fantastic and they all worked so well collaboratively.
- Some children made their own seesaw with some wood they found.
- They created natural art pictures, using natural items found in the woodland.
- They played in the mud kitchen, creating potions using fruit, seeds, coconuts and food colouring.
- They explored and learnt to use a range of tools to create works of art, using hammers, nails, screws and conker holders.
- The children had time to go on bug hunts and spot and identify wildlife within the school grounds.
- They learnt to take risks and had the opportunity to climb trees.(Something we believe children do not do enough of these days).
- They made bird pizza feeders, using raisins, seeds and chopped fruit.
- Making jewellery out of leaves and string.
- Making a tumble dryer with a large tube!

As you can see, our wonderful woodland project gives all our children some of the most amazing experiences that the ordinary indoor classroom just cannot cater for! Letting kids be kids.

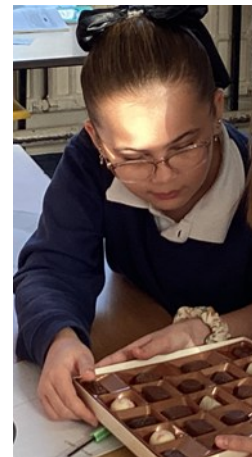

That is why the Government has advised us all to create a sustainability plan. So last half term, Mrs Munday and Miss Monck attended a very interesting conference to help get us started!

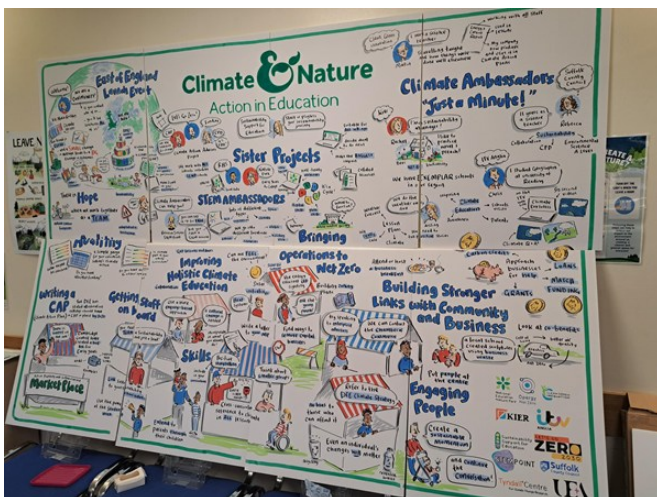
We learnt a lot about reducing the amount of energy and water we use and also ideas to reduce wastage within school.

Miss Monck, the new sustainability lead, held a meeting with the Woodland Working Group / Eco Warriors as soon as she got back into school and they too, are very excited to begin our new sustainability journey! They will assist Miss Monck on leading an assembly this next half term, so all the children are aware and can take ownership. Our main focus to begin with will be water usage. We are looking into slower flowing taps and will be monitoring the amount of water being used and what is being wasted. We have already ordered a smart metre.

We are also looking into printing with teachers and a competition between all staff is now underway. Who can reduce their amount of printing in the next 8 weeks? The winner will receive an eco friendly surprise!

Maybe you could help at home. Did you know leaving the tap on to clean your teeth will use 9 litres of water but if you turn it off, you will only be using 3!

If we all made these little changes, we could help to make a real difference, and you could save on bills too! It's a win win.

We suggest that you open the email and follow the instructions to set up an account with Pupil Asset, **using the email address that we hold for you**. You will be asked to set your own password.

After you have registered, you can book your appointment using the account details you have set up. If you have not received an email or have any problems, please contact the school office.

The portal also allows you to update your personal details, such as address and telephone updates.

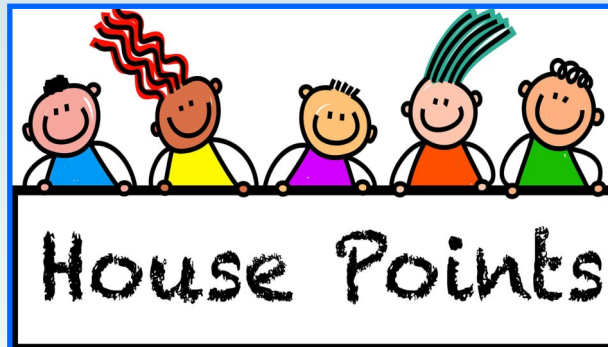

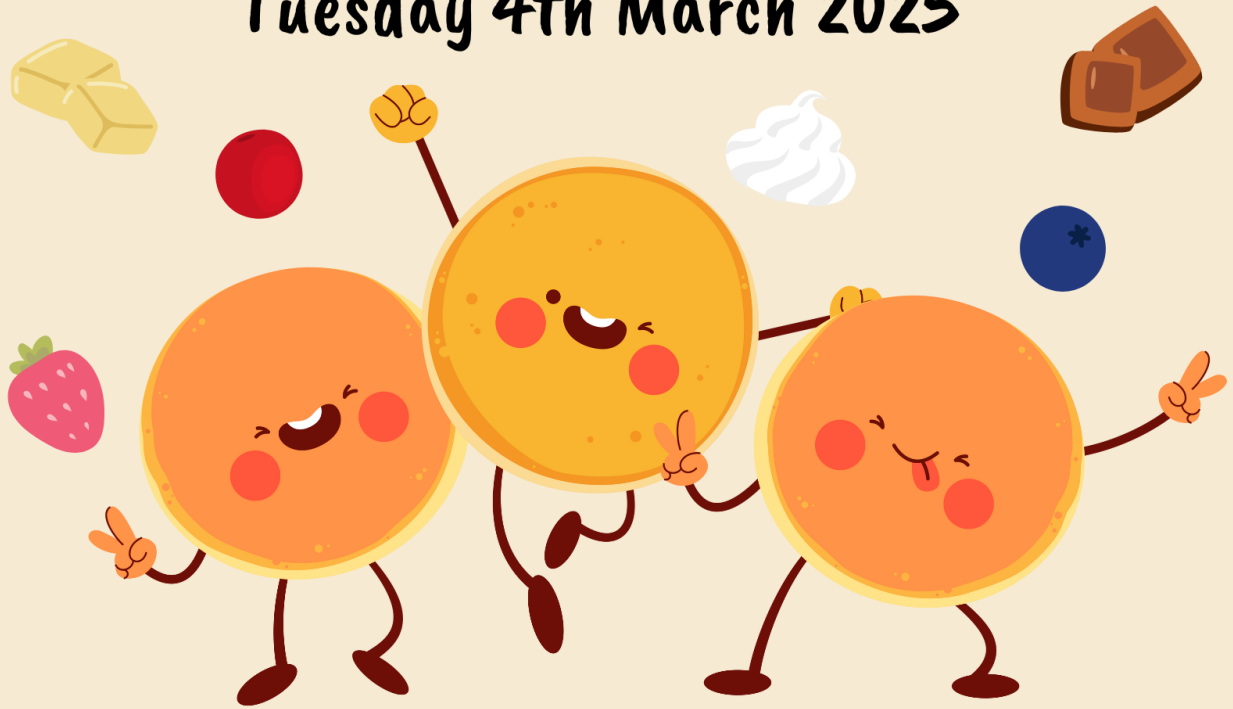
Lewis in Oak Class was invited over half term to play a match for Norwich FC at the Avant Training Centre.
