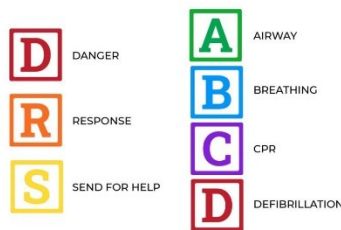




Crucial Crew - Yr 6



Elder Class had a very exciting afternoon on Wednesday 30th April, when they, as well as many other local schools, attended Kings Lynn Fire Station to take part in a Crucial Crew learning experience. The children took part in a number of essential and very informative short sessions to teach them about safety. They learnt the DRSABCD acronym...



...when responding to a first aid situation and were shown how to perform CPR and how to put an unconscious casualty into the recovery position. St John's Ambulance stressed the importance of downloading the 'What3words' app onto mobile phones to enable emergency services to be able to promptly attend any emergency.



Additionally, the children were asked to consider what constitutes an emergency situation and what to pack if they were in an evacuation. The RNLI reinforced safety around water, with the children being asked to identify risks at the beach. The children learnt that if they are ever in trouble in the water that they should do a star float and alert for help. Another of the sessions was about staying safe online, where they were taught about keeping all information personal and it was stressed that people who they don't know online are strangers and the same safety measures should be followed as they would in real life. The dangers of and legalities of potential bullying and sharing intimate photographs was also reinforced in a very child-appropriate manner. Another of the sessions focused on consent, with children being encouraged to really listen to the views and requests of others and that if anything concerns them, regarding others respecting their bodies, that they should tell a trusted adult. Fire prevention was another crucial learning aspect for Elder Class where the children identified household items that could be potential fire risks: leaving straighteners on, overloading extension leads, using 2-way block plugs, leaving aerosol cans on windowsills, charging electronic devices overnight and playing with lighters and matches. The children also learnt about 'Test it Tuesday' where household fire alarms (that should be installed on every storey) should be tested weekly.

The children were a credit to themselves, yourselves and the school, with inquisitive questions being asked and impeccable behaviour being demonstrated. 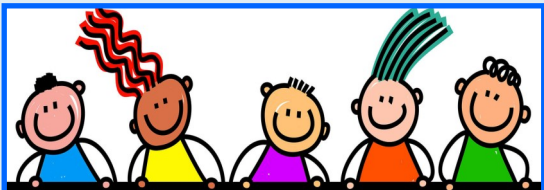

Butterfly Decline

Britons urged to stop mowing lawns to boost butterfly numbers 'in long-term decline'

Because of Beaupre's commitment to sustainability, we have planted lots of buddleia in our woodland area, as well as other pollinators and are now in consultation with our landscape company about leaving some of our grass to grow wild. We are also planning a couple of wildflower meadows in the school grounds to encourage more butterflies and other wildlife to enjoy our wonderful outdoor areas. So watch this space and keep an eye out for some exciting changes to our landscape.

Conservation experts say, Research shows letting part of a garden grow wild with long grass increases butterflies. Last year, 51 of the UK's 59 butterfly species showed a decline in numbers compared with figures for 2023."

This is great news for those of you who dread the chore of mowing your lawn.

Why not play your part and leave part of your lawn to grow wild this summer? It doesn't have to look 'messy', you could mow in wavy lines and get creative. See some of the pictures below for ideas.

You could plant some beautiful wildflower seed or when you are planting this year, please consider planting more pollinators in your gardens. Just look out for the bee symbol on the labels. Just swapping a few of your plants to these could really help our declining species.

Unfortunately, our modern day gardening habits are not helping our native wildlife to flourish. But if we all changed a little, together we could make a BIG difference.
