# Chestnut Class - Dinosaur Trip



Last Friday, Chestnut Class went on the most amazing trip to 'ROARR!' in Lenwade, Norwich. The day could not have been more perfect. The sun was shining and the children were a credit to Beaupre School and the local community.



There was that much to do, we might have to go back again! We started our adventure with an 'up close and personal' encounter with a Red Footed Tortoise. These creatures, who are not extinct, originate from northern South America and can live up to about 50 years. They are a medium-sized tortoises that average 30 cm as adults, but can reach over 40 cm. The week before, this tortoise had laid two eggs and we were able to hold the eggs. Everyone had the chance to stroke her but we were told to keep our fingers away from her head because this type of tortoise is a meat eater. Who knew that some tortoise are Carnivores! This little girl was regularly given a mouse to munch on. There were many animals to see including, rats, rabbits, snakes and a Bearded Dragon.



After washing our hands, we visited the Valley of the Dinosaurs where we encountered many dinosaurs of various sizes. The class were particularly pleased to find the Brachiosaurus, 'Big Brachi', who they had been writing to and received letters from. After lunch, we had the chance to dig for fossils just like Mary Anning, the famous fossil hunter, that we have been learning about. Of course there was time to explore the adventure play park before we headed back to civilization.

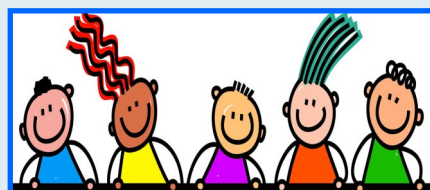

## Our school milk scheme

Beaupre will be providing a milk scheme that will be available to all of our pupils from 12th of May. Milk is provided by 'Cool Milk' and will be delivered each week starting on 12th May. Thank you to those parents that have registered, your children will have milk in school on w/c 12th May. If you have not yet registered and you would like your child to have milk, please register as below.

- Free for children under 5
- Subsidised for over 5s
- Pupil Premium children will receive milk paid for by the school. Pupil Premium children do not have to register online. Please ask for a form from the office
- When your child turns 5 you can choose to pay for milk - this is done directly with 'Cool Milk'
- We recommend that you register with Cool Milk online [www.coolmilk.com](http://www.coolmilk.com)
- 189mls of semi-skimmed milk every day. Provided in recyclable Tetra Pak cartons



## P.E/Swimming Lessons

Only **one pair of simple stud earrings** are allowed to be worn to school. They must be removed by the child themselves for PE and swimming. We recommend children come to school without earrings in on swimming and PE days, for Health & Safety purposes. If not, they must take them out and replace them themselves. They cannot be taped. Parents will be called to remove when a child is unable to do this themselves.

If your child is planning on having his/her ears pierced, where possible the Summer Holiday would be the best time, to ensure your child does not have to miss PE/swimming sessions.
