Oak Class—Planetarium Workshop

On Wednesday 21st May, Oak Class immersed themselves in a visit from the planetarium. The children ventured into the planetarium dome, where they were engaged in a workshop discussing the properties of all the planets and the various missions of both humans and animals into space. Following our travel into the space dome, we then engaged in a range of space themed activities, such as designing a space craft that would be suitable to travel to Mars (one of the coldest planets in space). We designed our spacecraft using clay and Lego blocks and shared these with our peers. It was a fantastic learning opportunity and certainly embedded the children's learning of space, as one of our previously covered Science topics. The children were provided with space frozen strawberries, which some of the children thoroughly enjoyed, others not so much. The children demonstrated great knowledge and asked fantastic thought provoking questions. Well done Oak Class





On Friday afternoon Oak class had an amazing time learning in the forest. They constructed two den sites and pretended they were in a Greek battle, created recipes and wonderful concoctions in the mud kitchen, also now named by the children as 'Cooking with Charlie'. They applied problem solving skills, trying to articulate how they were going to sit in the hammock without falling out, they walked the tight rope, made ramps and assault courses and had a thoroughly enjoyable time in the woodland.



Elder Class - Mental Health Support Team

On Monday morning, the Mental Health Support Team came in to talk to our Year 6 children about their transition to secondary school. The children shared their feelings of both excitement and worries around their future move to 'big' school. Worries were shared; those that are helpful and unhelpful and children explored problem solving around this and were encouraged to look at their strengths and goals. The children have learned new strategies to embrace change. They have been provided with transition booklets; please share these with your children.

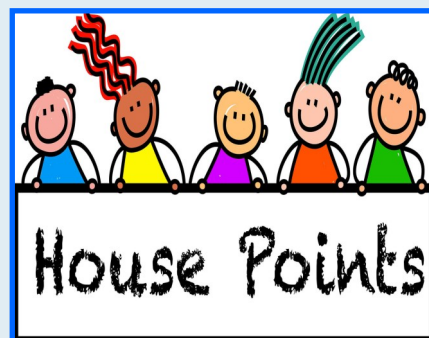

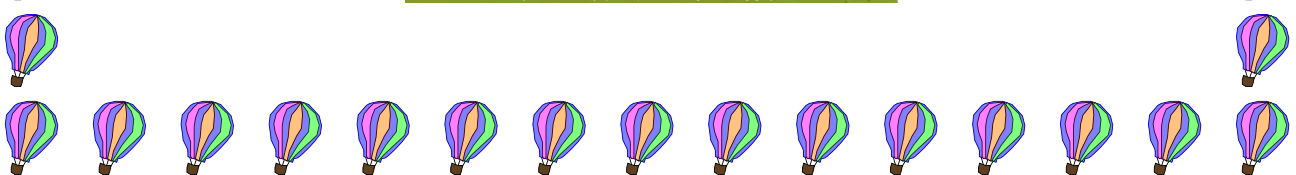


Summer Reading Challenge
