Shacklewell Hollow Residential Trip



Year 6 have had an incredibly exciting week! The children visited Shacklewell Hollow, accompanied by Mrs Summers, Mrs Riley and Mrs Calver, where they stayed overnight! Fenland Adventure hosted the event they provided a number of activities across the two days, to develop and challenge our children. On arrival, the children undertook team building activities, where they had to work together and communicate clearly to solve problems. They also took part in a bushcraft activity; they learnt how to safely light a fire with flint and enjoyed tasting gooey marshmallows. Crate stacking really challenged our children with their building skills and they were so brave when balancing on the top of the high wobbling crate towers (thankfully, they were all fully harnessed). The climbing wall was a firm favourite, where children really tested themselves with climbing as high as they could on varying routes of difficulty and dismounting by letting go of the wall and descending down by harness (which adults can relay, from personal experience, was very scary). In the evening, the children were entertained by playing capture the flag and on the water slide, they had the time of their lives. Archery and orienteering were other skills that the children had the opportunity to learn during their visit. Our hosts were so welcoming and great fun too and the food was fantastic! Bedtime antics kept us adults on our toes – well done to those who managed to get to sleep before midnight! The children were amazing: super enthusiasm, courage and manners! Very well done!







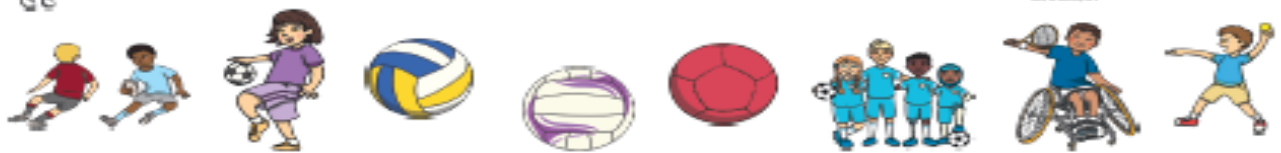
Sports Day - 24th June 2025

Weather permitting, Sports Day is Tuesday 24th June 9:00-1:00pm. In preparation of our OPAL launch day, we would like all children to bring into school a **named** pair of wellies to use outside when the weather is wet.

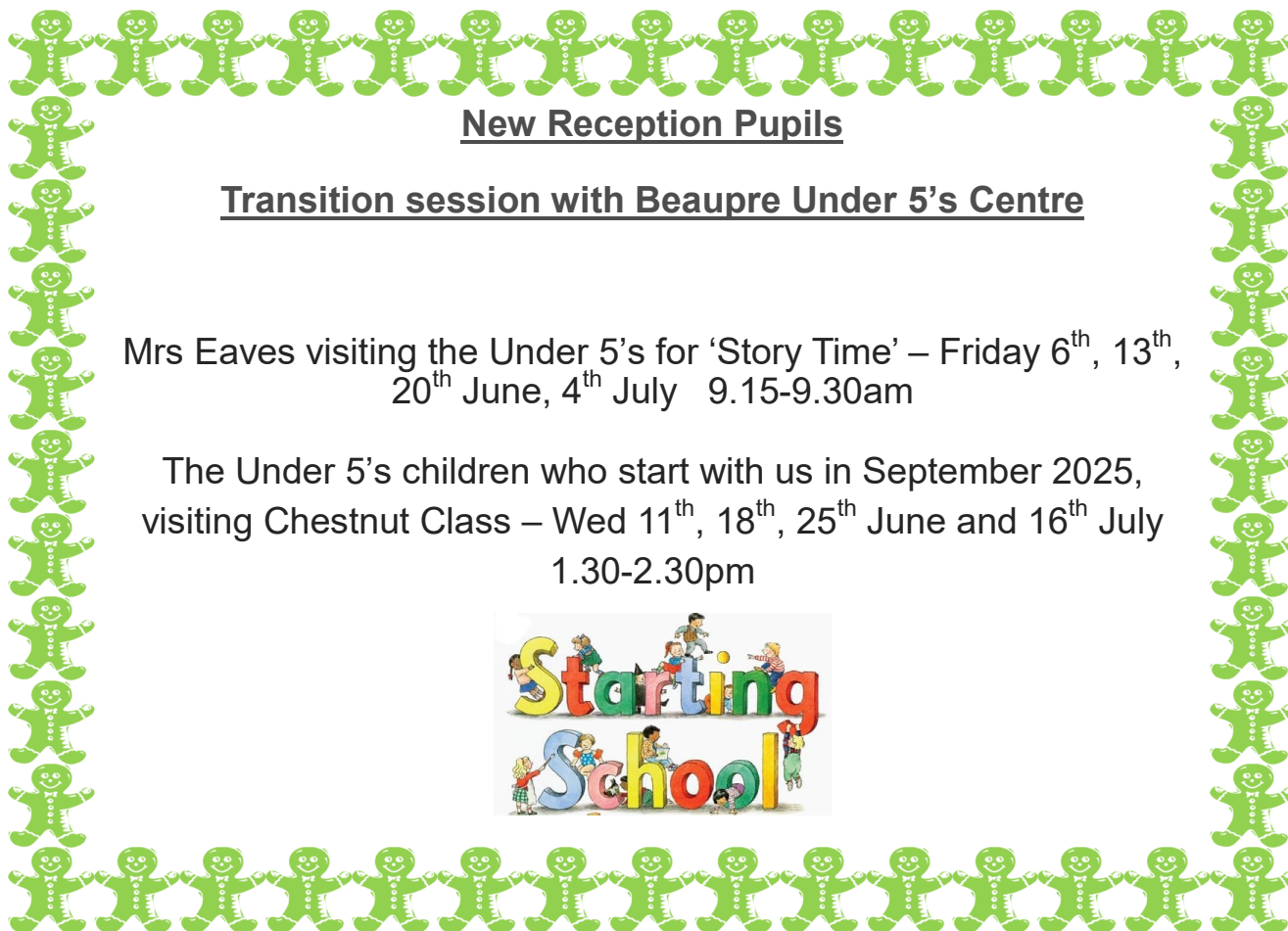
The wellies will be kept in school.

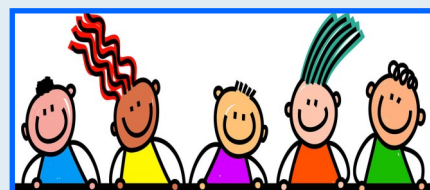
