Year 1 - Wisbech Reads Literacy Festival

What an absolutely fantastic day our Year 1 pupils had on Tuesday when they ventured out to Wisbech for the literacy festival!

The day began with something rather unusual an utterly captivating session with an author with a focus on poo! Now, before you raise your eyebrows, the session and theme brilliantly captivated our young learners. The children had the privilege of listening to the author read from his brand-new book 'Poopicorn', which won't even be released until Thursday 19th June. This delightful story follows a unicorn who poops whatever they think about – you can imagine how much this tickled our Year 1s!

The learning didn't stop there. Our pupils discovered the fascinating process of how picture books are created and even tried their hand at drawing characters, stepping into the shoes of real illustrators. I found it particularly interesting to learn that most picture books contain exactly 32 pages – this isn't by chance, but because that's the maximum number of pictures that can fit on a single piece of paper during the printing process. Any more pages would significantly increase production costs. The children will receive their very own copy of this special book to treasure!

Our next stop was the local library, where the children immersed themselves in creative activities to construct an animal display. They learned about the valuable services libraries provide, including how to borrow books, while having the opportunity to explore the wonderful collection of books available. It's so important for our pupils to understand and appreciate these community resources.

The final part of our adventure took us to the museum, where the poo theme continued with even more engaging exploration! The pupils learned about different animals and their diets, making important connections between what animals eat and what they produce. They examined the differences between herbivores, omnivores and carnivores through hands-on investigation. The highlight was undoubtedly when the children examined pretend poo samples to determine which animals they might belong to – educational and entertaining in equal measure!

The pupils returned to school having had an absolutely amazing time, and I must extend my heartfelt gratitude to Mrs Shinn and the parent helpers who contributed to making this such a wonderful and memorable day for our children. Their support and enthusiasm helped create an experience our Year 1s will remember.

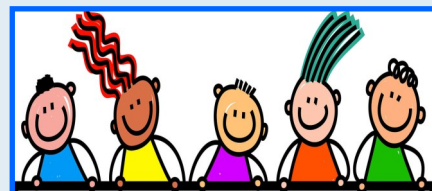

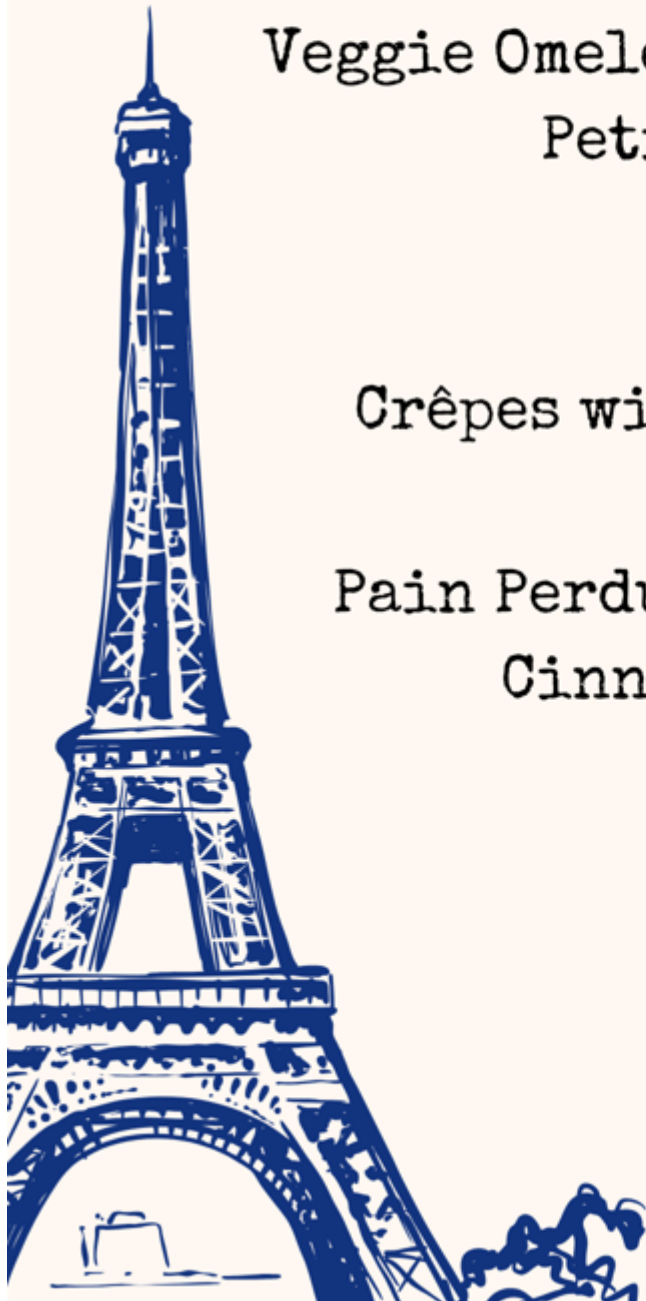
