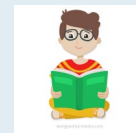

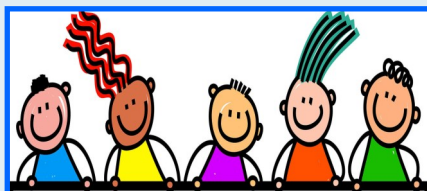

We'll also be joining in with the fun here in school! Each class will grow their own sunflower in the green space at the front of our school, and there will be a prize for the winning class!

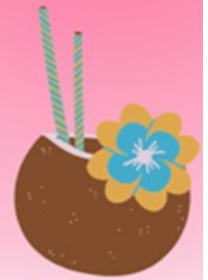

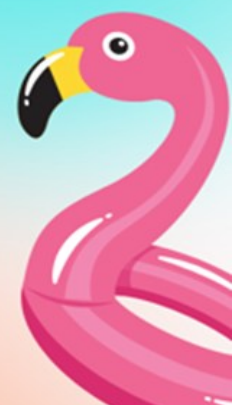

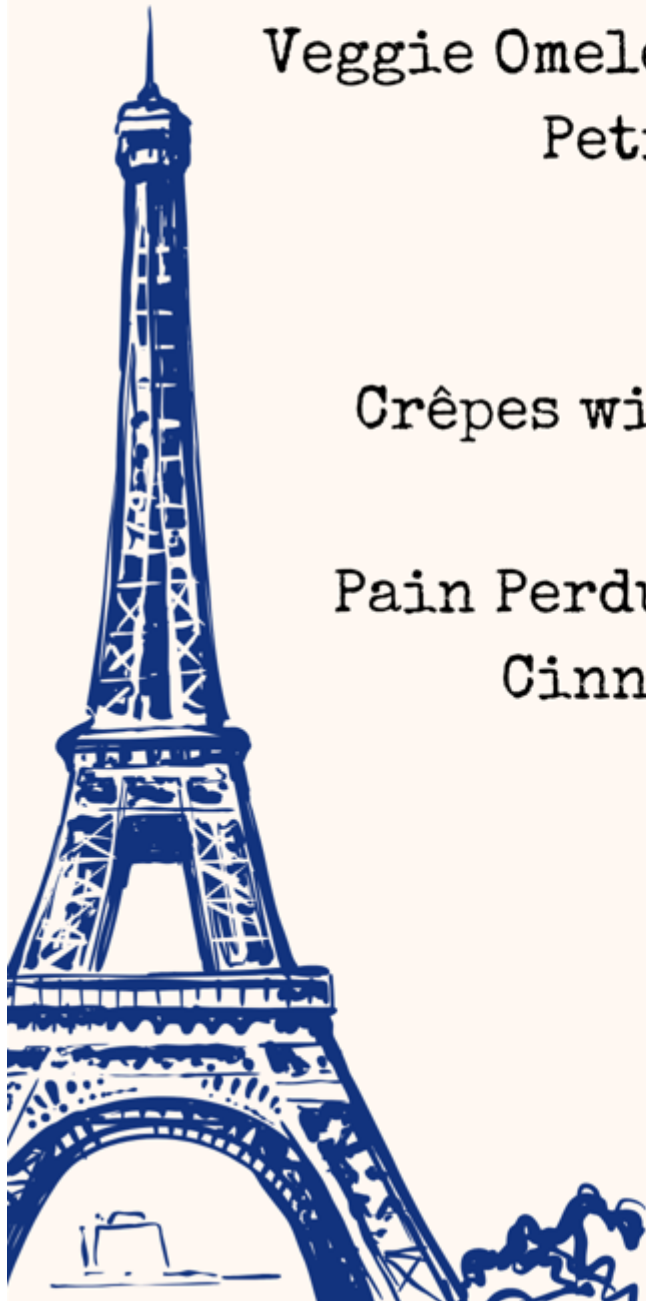
