Charlotte in Oak Class received a swimming certificate for 'Learn to Swim' Level 6.

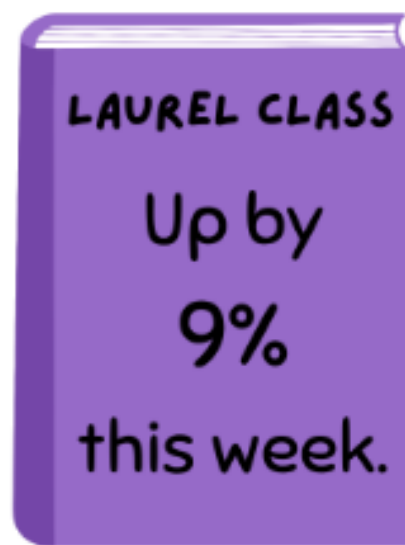
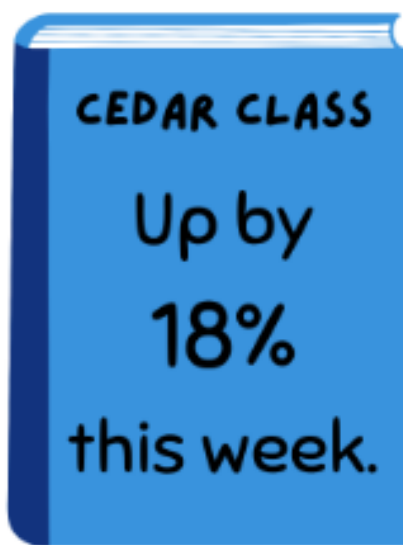


REMARKABLE READING

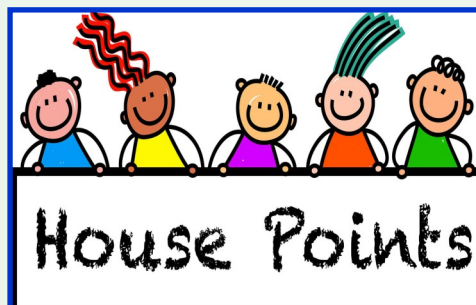
