# War Memorial



To complement their learning on WW2, on Monday 10th November, Year 6 walked to the village's war memorial to pay their respects to the fallen soldiers from the First and Second World Wars and were able to consider local names, soldiers who were related and dates when the soldiers died. The children listened to For the Fallen by Laurence Binyon followed by two minutes of reflective silence. The children's maturity and sensitivity at this solemn mark of respect was extremely impressive.





## Armistice Day - Art Project

To commemorate Armistice day, every child created a poppy which was displayed on a recycled milk carton. A LED bulb was attached to the bottom of each bottle so that they would be illuminated as darkness fell. As you can see, the effect was a very respectful tribute to those who lost their lives during WWI and WWII. The names of the fallen from our village were written on the bottles. We hope you all had chance to see this amazing display during evening hours.

## Anti-Bullying Week

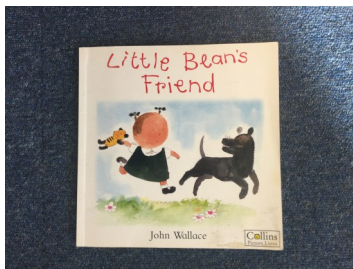


For Anti-Bullying Week 2025, Beaupre's children were able to consolidate their understanding that bullying is:

Additionally, children had the opportunity to explore and write about bullying from the perspective of the bully, to help think about reasons for bullying, as a means to preventing and stopping it.

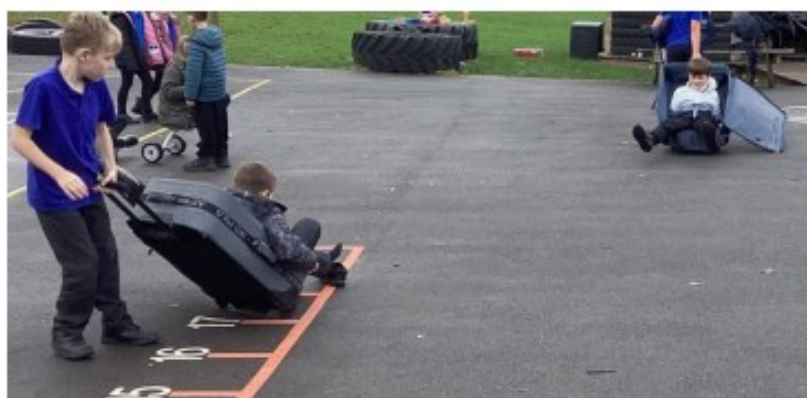




### Opal Fun and Adventures! ✨

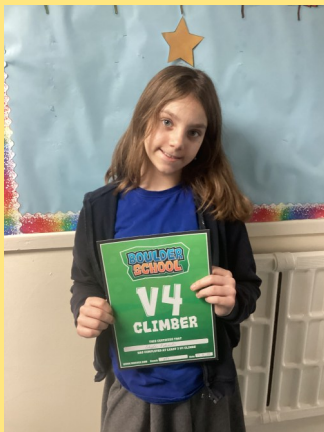
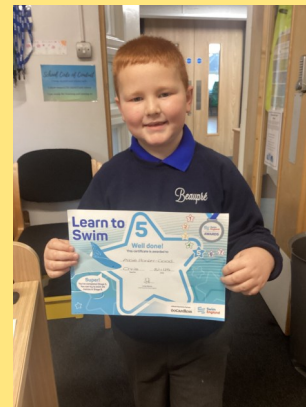


## Outside Achievements

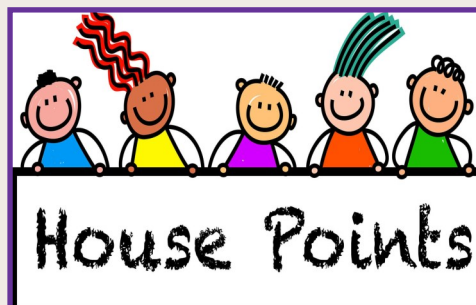

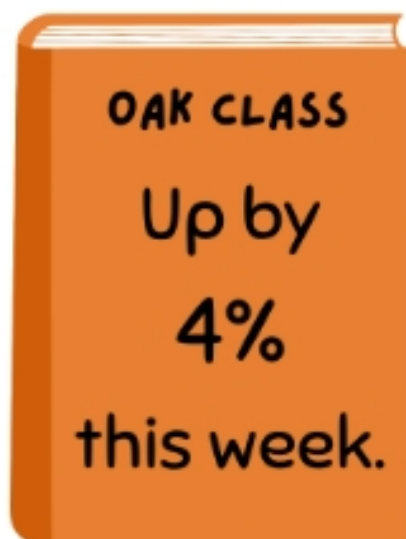
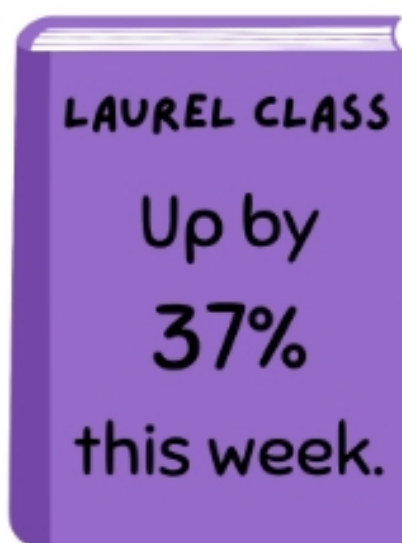
