Welcome to this week's newsletter.

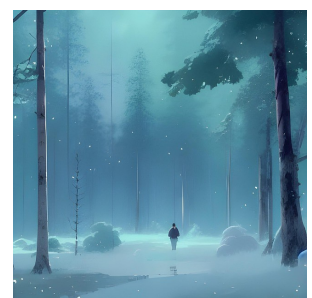

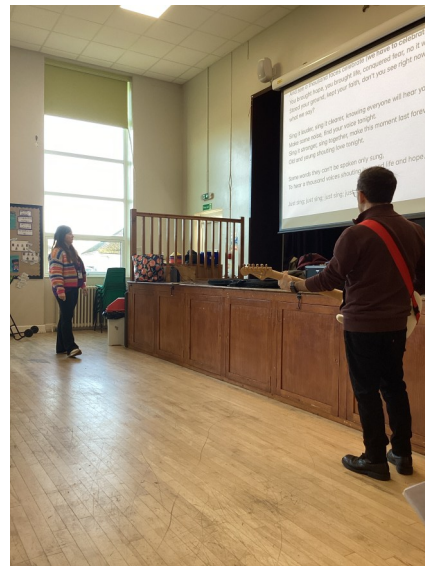
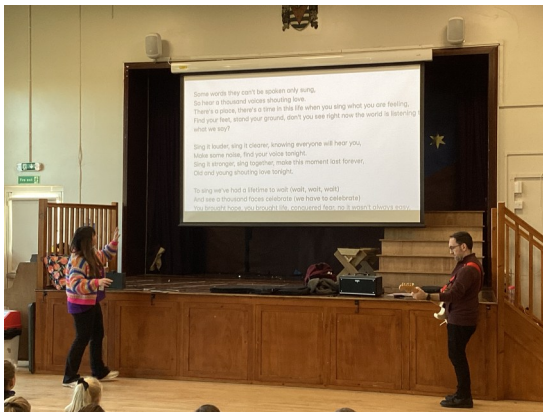

Smoking & Vaping Workshop

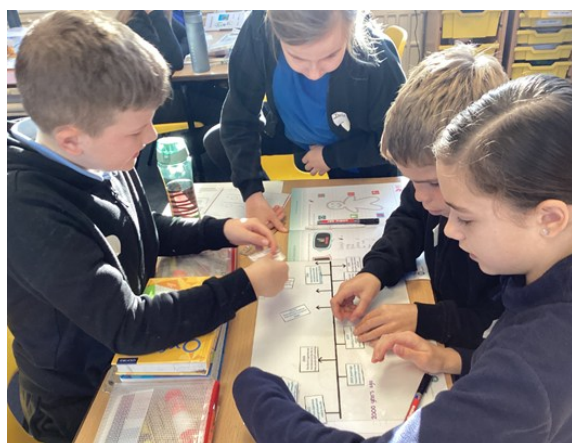
Smoking & Vaping Workshop

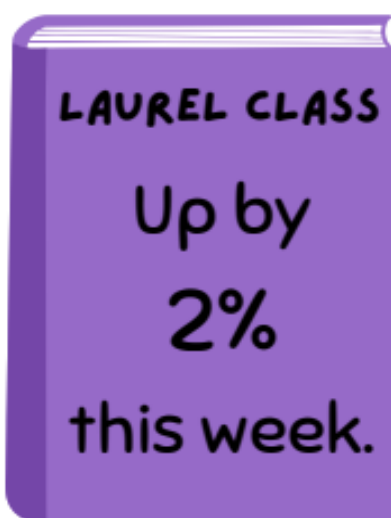
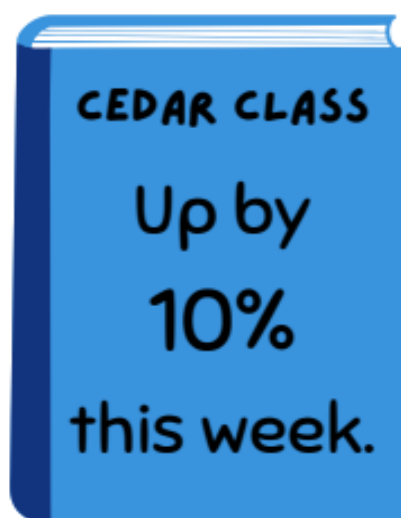


REMARKABLE READING

Lets see how much we have read this week!



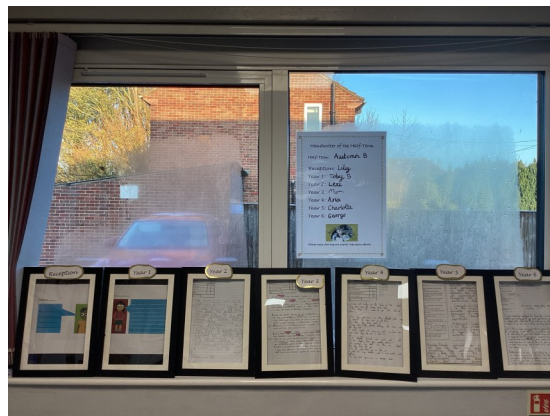

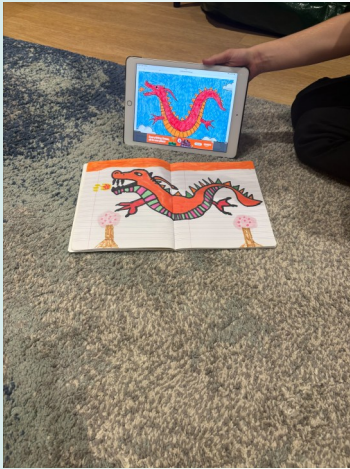

For the week ending Friday 14th November, Cedar, Laurel, Oak & Elder Classes' attendance were over 96% and they have received a star.

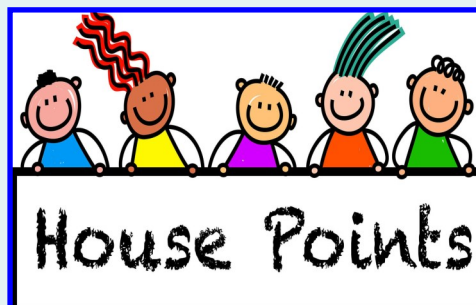

Is your child too ill for school?

It can be tricky deciding whether or not to keep your child off school, when they're unwell. There are government guidelines [NHS guidance](#) for schools about managing specific infectious disease. They say when children should be kept off school and when they shouldn't.

If you do keep your child at home, it's important to phone us on the first day and give us a reason for absence. Please see below the following advice from the NHS on other illnesses:

Coughs and colds

It's fine to send your child to school with minor coughs or common colds. But if they have a fever, keep them off school until the fever goes.

High temperature

If your child has a high temperature, keep them off school until it goes away.

Chickenpox

If your child has chickenpox, keep them off school until all the spots have crusted over. This is usually about 5 days after the spots first appeared.

Cold sores

There's no need to keep your child off school if they have a cold sore.

Conjunctivitis

You don't need to keep your child away from school if they have conjunctivitis. Do get advice from your pharmacist. Encourage your child not to rub their eyes and to wash their hands regularly.

Vomiting and diarrhoea

Children with diarrhoea or vomiting should stay away from school until they have not been sick or had diarrhoea for at least 2 days (48 hours).

Scarlet fever

If your child has scarlet fever, they'll need treatment with antibiotics from a GP. Your child can go back to school 24 hours after starting antibiotics.

Sore Throat

You can still send your child to school if they have a sore throat. But if they also have a high temperature, they should stay at home until it goes away. A sore throat and a high temperature can be symptoms of tonsillitis.

If you need any further advice on other common illnesses, please contact the school office.

NOROVIRUS

Look out for symptoms like:

- Vomiting
- Diarrhoea
- Stomach cramps

Speak to a teacher, colleague or adult if you believe you have symptoms.

- Contaminated food, water, and surfaces

There is no specific treatment other than support from people around you.

People tend to recover within 1-3 days
