WW2 Day—Elder Class



On Thursday 27th November 2025, Elder Class had the opportunity to take part in a WW2 day to enhance their History topic.

Additionally, we are sincerely grateful to Aspens who came into class to teach the children about rationing. The class were then given the opportunity to make their own carrot cake using rationed food items.

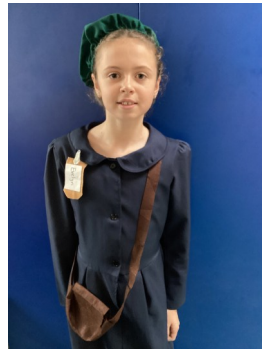

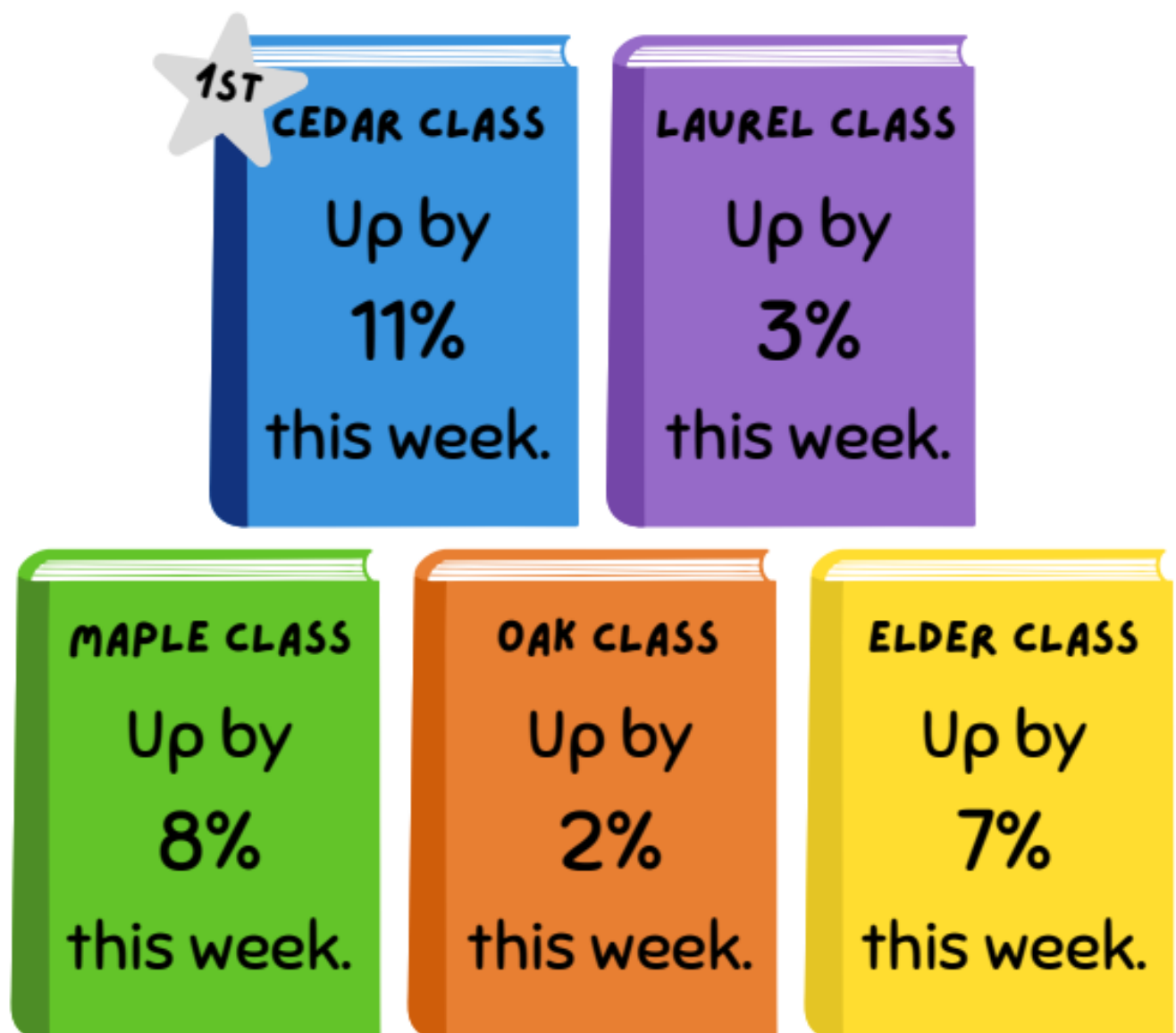


REMARKABLE READING

For the week ending Friday 21st November, Maple Class attendance was over 96% and they have received a star.

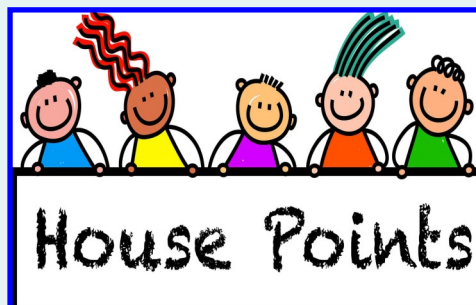
