Peer Mediation

We are very excited and delighted to let you know that this year's peer mediation service will be starting from Monday! Year 6 children have all had the opportunity to undertake peer mediator training, to apply for the role and to experience the interview process. The successful applicants are: Marcie, Jamie, Levi, Aiden, Jasmin, Charlie, Dalton, Jack H, Lily and Megan (who have been introduced to the school, as peer mediators, during this week's assembly). The role of a peer mediator is to be proactive in identifying and preventing potential conflict between children in the playground. Should children have difficulty in resolving their own conflict through strategies taught in school, peer mediators are available (under the supervision of a pastoral TA) to guide them through resolving their conflict. Peer mediators also act in the capacity of 'worry wardens' so if any child has a concern that they would prefer to talk to another child about, as opposed to an adult, they can speak to one of these children (again this will be under the supervision of a pastoral TA).
