Many thanks to the parents who joined us in the forest. It was a lovely afternoon!

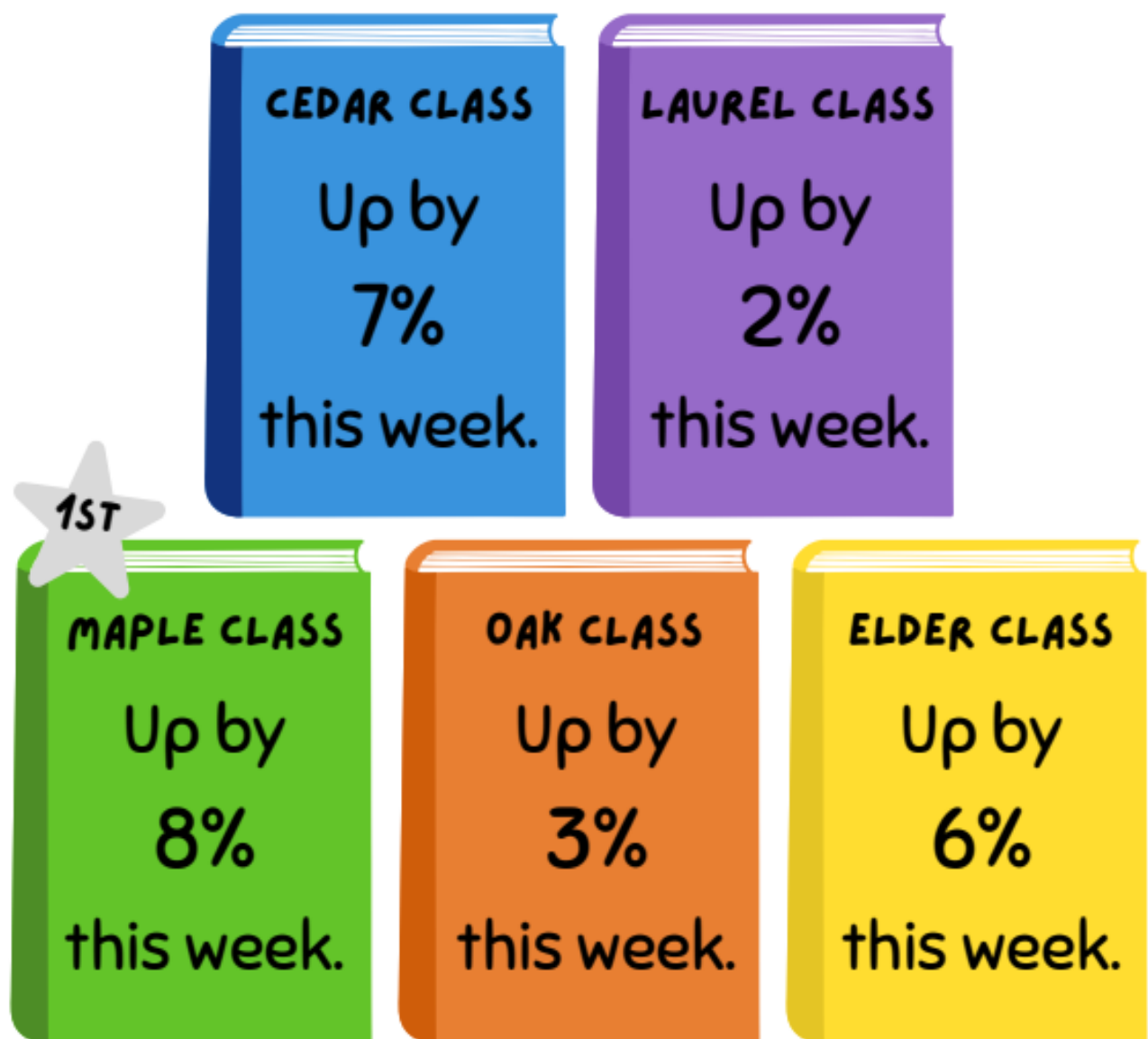


REMARKABLE READING

For the week ending Friday 5th December, Laurel and Maple Classes' attendance was over 96% and they have received a star.

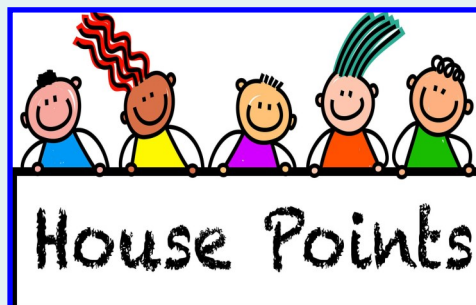
