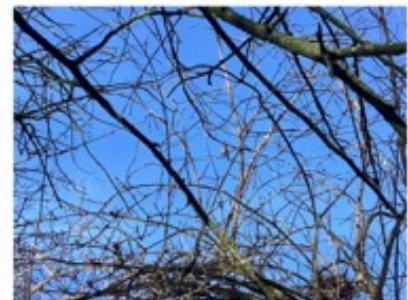
Maple Class braved the cold, wet weather for their forest session on Tuesday afternoon. Making the most of the weather, the children enjoyed creating dens to protect themselves from the rain and we were very impressed with how well they worked together. Other children enjoyed making creations in the mud kitchen using flowers to add decoration and scent to their recipes.





Cedar Class had a lovely afternoon in the forest this week. We focused on wild birds, as the bare trees make it easier to spot birds at this time of year. The children enjoyed making food for the birds the day before, using seeds and melted lard in cupcake cases. We attached string to allow the children to tie the feeders to the branches of a tree in the forest area. In the forest, we spotted a singing robin who the children enjoyed watching with their binoculars. They drew pictures of the robin using clipboards to hold the paper still.

Once the children had removed their bird feeders from the cupcake cases, they used the cases to make mud cakes in the kitchen area. There were lots of types of foliage to choose from to add toppings to the mud cakes. The children also used these natural resources to make bird nests on the ground and even found some worms to tempt down the birds. The children also enjoyed playing imaginatively with sticks, using the slack line and the hammock.





On the afternoon of 29th January 2026, the children were able to use the forest to enhance their learning in English. The weather (which was very chilly) helped to set the scene for our Narnia theme – as did the forest floor being covered with 'snow' otherwise known as flour. The children were tasked with making the wardrobe, as well as mini versions, the White Witch's sledge, the dwarf's home, and they additionally created magical potion and Turkish Delight with which to lure Edmund.

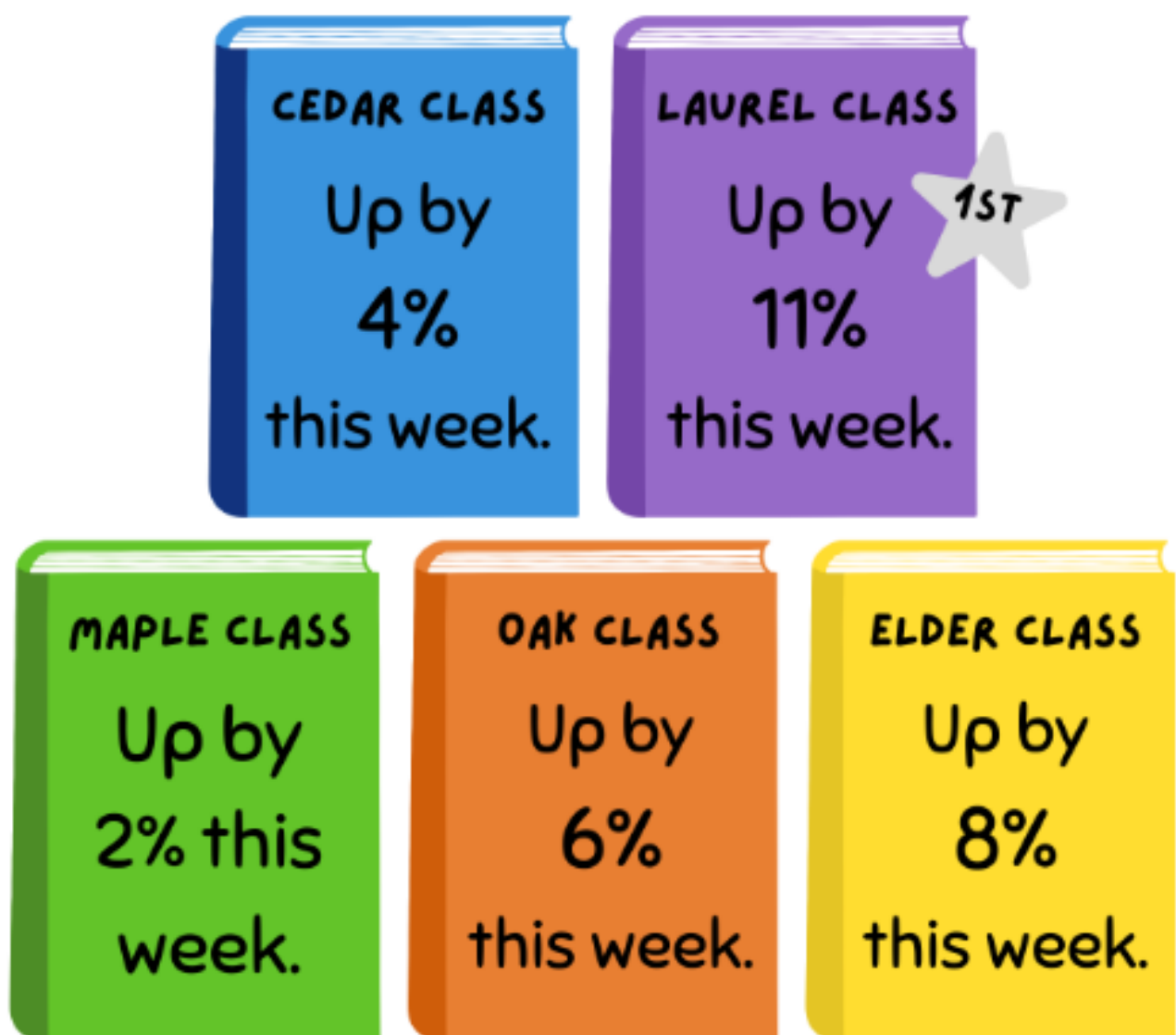


REMARKABLE READING

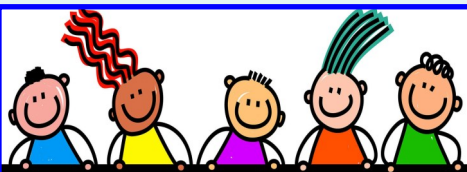

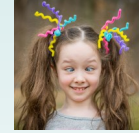

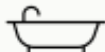

Parents and carers often prioritise the needs of others and place their own wellbeing last, which can increase the risk of stress and burnout. Children learn by example, and when they see adults acknowledging their feelings and taking steps to care for themselves, they develop the skills to recognise and manage their own wellbeing.

Create a paper lantern

Tuesday 17th February is Chinese New Year and 2026 is the year of the fire horse, symbolising growth mindset in the form of independence, creativity, ambition and energy to name only a few.



Why not create a paper lantern to celebrate.



- Take a piece of A4 paper or thin card.
- Fold it in half lengthways and make equally spaced cuts along the length of the paper/card (using scissors) - Make sure you leave a 3cm gap at the top and bottom and both ends of the paper/card.
- Open the paper/card and fold it round into a cylinder shape.
- Glue or sticky tape the ends together and decorate your lantern with paints, pens, sequins or sticky gems.
