### This week's vocabulary

#### Astronaut

A person who has been specially trained to travel into space. They work for space agencies and fly in spacecrafts to explore beyond Earth, conduct scientific experiments, and maintain space stations.

Scientists at NASA are preparing to send **astronauts** back to the Moon.

#### Crew

A group of people who work together to operate a vehicle, like a ship, a plane, or a spacecraft. The **crew** will then return to Earth.

#### Curiosity

A strong desire to learn, discover, or wonder about something.

Space missions can provide an opportunity for **curiosity**.

#### Mission

An important task or a specific journey that a person or a group is sent to complete. The next **mission** is Artemis II.

#### Navigate

To find your way from one place to another. Victor will help fly and **navigate** the spacecraft.

#### Preparing

Getting everything ready before you start a task or a journey.

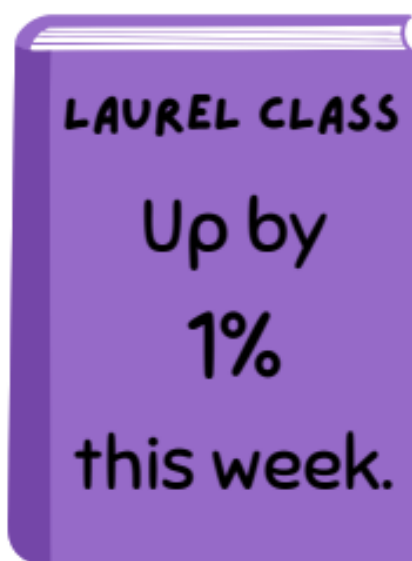
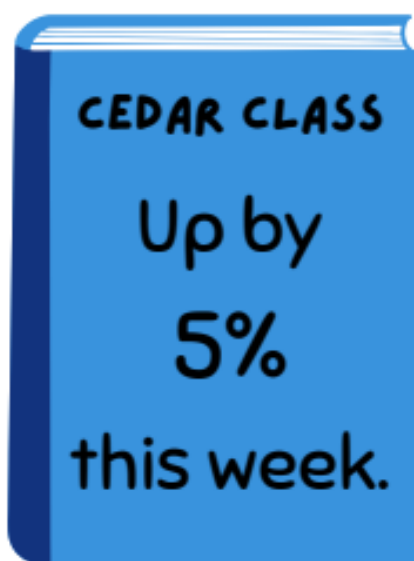


# REMARKABLE READING

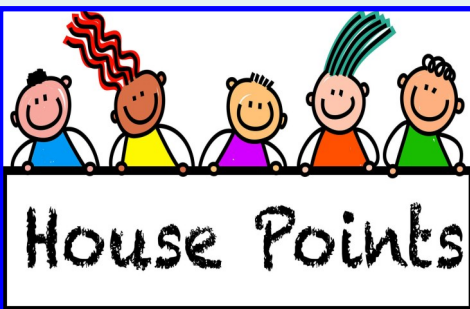

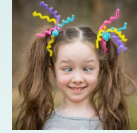
