World Book Day - 2026

Chestnut Class

What a wonderful day we had in Chestnut Class! It was truly special to have families join us for our reading café. We began with a familiar favourite, 'The Hungry Caterpillar' by Eric Carle, which inspired a range of creative activities throughout the day. Our pupils enjoyed making masks, crafting caterpillars and butterflies from playdough, and colouring beautiful butterfly designs. We built characters and objects from other popular stories using Lego, wrote about different characters, and played eye spy to spot hidden characters in pictures. Mrs Riley joined us as our guest reader, bringing enjoyment to the stories she read. Thank you to all the families who came along and made it such a special occasion.



Cedar Class

Cedar Class were very excited to enter the classroom this morning and compare World Book Day costumes. We took some lovely group photos and a class picture before heading to the hall for the assembly. After assembly, the children returned to the classroom for a book quiz. The children worked with a partner to answer questions about children's books.

Following this, the parents joined us for a reading cafe where we shared the story 'Speak Up' by Nathan Bryon, in which the main character, Rocket, talks about the books she enjoys and leads a protest to stop her local library being closed down. The children then made their own full page illustration, like one in the book, showing their reading interests. This was also an opportunity to discuss the books they enjoy reading. We also enjoyed a few biscuits and squash, too!

After break, the children enjoyed hearing a story read by mystery reader, Mrs Jennett. In the afternoon, we learnt and performed a poem by Joshua Seigal called 'How to Make a Dog'. The children came up with their own actions and we performed it outside on the stage in glorious sunshine. We then headed back inside to design a national book token for the World Book Day competition. The children had a wonderful day!

During the morning, the children joined forces with Laurel Class to join in with the National Literacy Trust's World Book Day Quiz on Zoom. The quiz suited football fans and book fans alike as the National Literacy Trust had partnered with the Premier League.

Following on from the quiz, the children took part in the Reading Cafe where they listened to Mr Daydream. During the Reading Cafe, the children enjoyed a variety of activities such as making their own mini books, reading related quizzes and playing a book character version of 'Heads Up'.

After break, Maple Class enjoyed listening to a story read to them by Mrs Shinn and they created book character related recycling posters in theme with the book which was shared with them.

During the afternoon, the children designed their own book vouchers around the theme of reading for pleasure. Then, to end the day, Mrs Jennett and Mrs Shinn created and performed a puppet show for the class.

A very exciting and enjoyable day was had by all with some more activities to come which include decorating our classroom door and performing poetry.

Oak Class

To celebrate World Book Day, Oak Class learnt the importance of reading, the opportunities to read for pleasure and the skills reading develops such as creativity, imagination, vocabulary and spellings. The children engaged in reading comprehensions about the pleasure of reading, created bookmarks, completed word searches and crosswords based on famous texts. In the afternoon, they designed a World Book Day cover for the door of our classroom, wrote a poem about the love of reading (winners to be declared for our class performance this term) and designed a book token for the National Book Token.

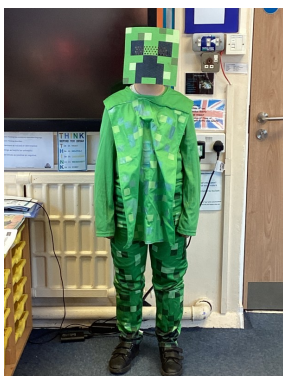


Elder Class

To kickstart activities in the classroom, all of KS2 took part in World Book Day's 'Great Big Footy and Booky Quiz'. Knowledge was exceptional, with our score at the end of the quiz being 18 out of 20. The children enjoyed listening to famous football players and authors who participated in the event.

The theme of Elder Class's learning was a blast from the past – with Miss Summers being Sally Strawberry from the Munch Bunch. After reading Ladybird's Munch Bunch and The Treehouse, watching a vintage episode (where the children were aghast at the graphics) and enjoying an 80s advert about Munch Bunch yoghurt, the children were tasked with dragging this brand into the 21st Century. They were tasked with creating their own fruit of vegetables superhero to encourage children to eat more healthily. They also had to create and promote a brand, considering target audience, packaging and even a slogan. The children had some very impressive ideas!

After break, they enjoyed Bomb! By Jim Eldridge being shared by their mystery reader – from the Barrington Stoke range of books. The children then had the opportunity to design a World Book Day token for 2027; fingers crossed that we will have produced a winner! After lunch, the children considered a design for the classroom door that will promote reading for pleasure. This will be created on Monday, with judging taking place the following day. The afternoon was completed with William Blake's 'The Tyger' poem being shared, analysed and performed.

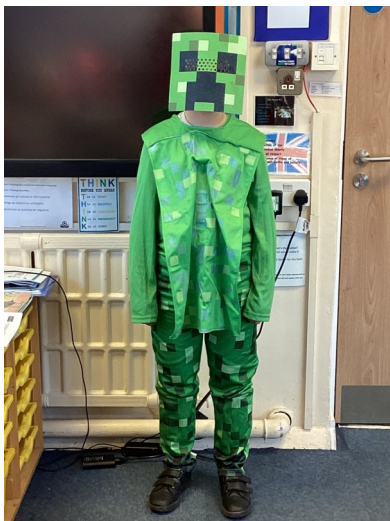
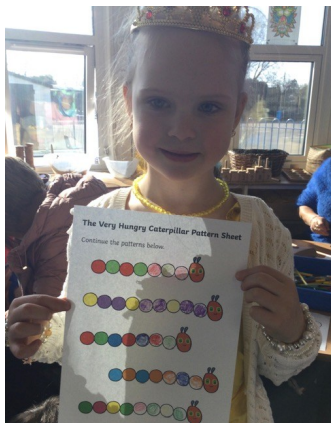

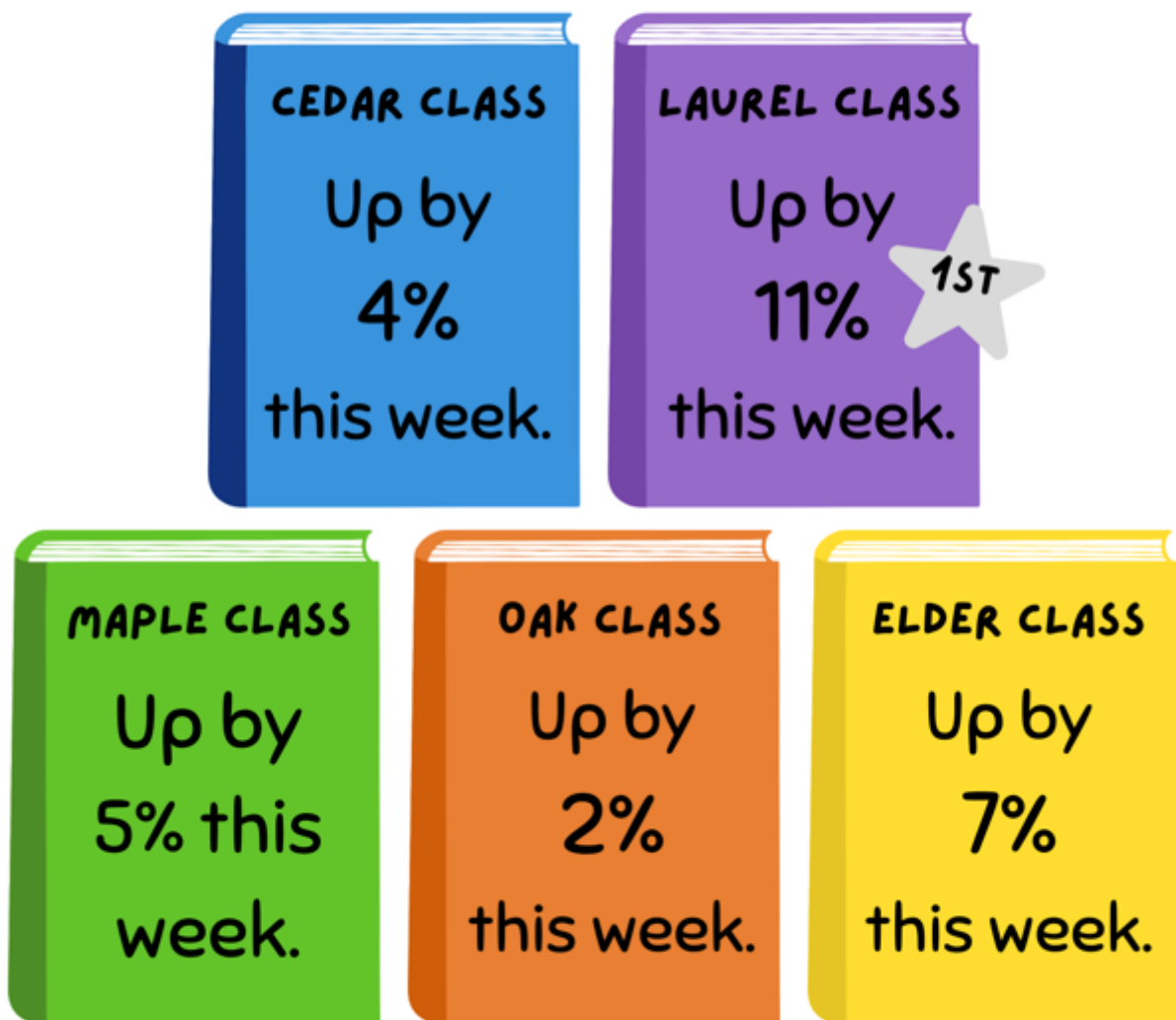


REMARKABLE READING

Maximus in Cedar Class received a trophy for being the 'Goalkeeper of the Week' for his awesome skills and determination.





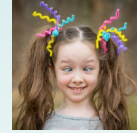
