## [Mobile Planetarium](#)

On Wednesday 25th March, Oak Class immersed themselves in a visit from the planetarium. The children ventured into the planetarium dome where they were engaged in a workshop discussing the properties of all the planets and the various missions of both humans and animals into space.

Following our travel into the space dome, we then engaged in a range of space themed activities such as designing a space craft that would be suitable to travel to Mars one of the coldest planets in space. We designed our spacecraft using clay and Lego blocks and shared these with our peers. It was a fantastic learning opportunity and certainly embedded the children's learning of space as our science topic this half term. The children demonstrated great knowledge and asked fantastic thought provoking questions.

Oak Class were provided with space frozen strawberries which some of the children thoroughly enjoyed, others not so much. We have had a phenomenal opportunity to have our school name featured on the next mission to Mars. The children have been provided a copy of the plaque to take home and treasure.

# Maths Day



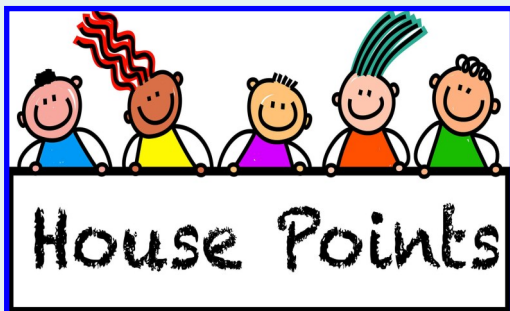

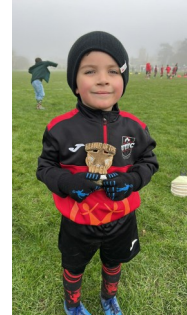
### Outside Achievements

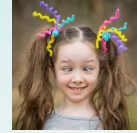

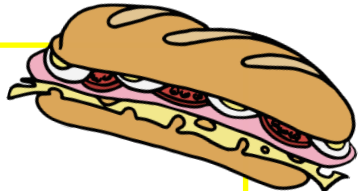
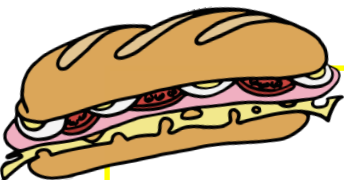

# Outwell Community Orchard and Memorial Garden



## What is going on?

We are transforming the Old Rec in Outwell into a community orchard and memorial garden for everyone to enjoy.

The orchard already has a number of trees, a wheelchair-friendly path leads from the gate to the memorial pergola which we hope will be used by the community as a respectful area to remember a loved one. Ashes can be strewn (booking necessary). Roses, memorial plaques, benches or planters can all be added and we are working hard to raise funds to complete the central area of hard landscaping, raised beds, seating and sensory planting.

There's lots to do.

We are a committee of volunteers including parish councillors and have spent two years so far planning this major project. Help is always welcomed - from grant applications to watering, planting, pruning, administration and raising awareness.

The World War II ammo store will be renovated and used for storage and we hope to commission an artist to create a mural around two sides of the building to bring it to life while conserving a piece of our history.

Dogs on leads will be welcome - but if people are not picking-up after them we will review that decision. There are CCTV cameras in place and there will be a dog bin.
