Year 1 - Wisbech Reads Literacy Festival



I had an absolutely fantastic day with our Year 1 pupils on Monday when they ventured out to Wisbech for the Literacy Festival!

The day began with a captivating session with the author Beach, and a focus on dragons! The children had the privilege of listening to the author read one of his stories 'The Dragon with the Blazing Bottom'. This delightful story tells the tale of Sir Wayne's dragon that has lost his flame. But, not to worry, Sir Wayne has a meal plan to solve the problem . . . What could possibly go wrong?!



The learning didn't stop there. Our pupils discovered the fascinating process of how picture books are created and even tried their hand at drawing characters, stepping into the shoes of real illustrators. We found out that most picture books contain exactly 32 pages – this isn't by chance, but because that's the maximum number of pictures that can fit on a single piece of paper during the printing process. Any more pages would significantly increase production costs.

Our next activity in the local library, the children immersed themselves in creating a shaker to be used to accompany a story read to them. They learned about the valuable services libraries provide, including how to borrow books, while having the opportunity to explore the wonderful collection of books available.

The final part of our adventure took us to the museum, where the dragon theme continued. The children learned about fossils and how these could have inspired people's imaginations to create stories about dragons. They explored adjectives to describe dragons and look for other items in the museum that matched these descriptive words. They all made a dragon's eye using coloured clay to take home as a memory from their day.

We all returned to school having had an absolutely amazing time. I would like to extend my gratitude to Mrs Shinn and Mrs Hall who helped make this such a wonderful and memorable day for our children.

Year 5 - Wisbech Reads Literacy Festival

Last Friday, Year 5 had a very exciting opportunity to take part in the Wisbech Reads Festival.

After the initial excitement of the arrival of a double-decker bus at the front of the school and the children so thrilled to be allowed to sit upstairs, we arrived to our first session in the Wisbech Museum. The session was based around going on a voyage based in the times of Ancient Greece. The children's knowledge of Ancient Greece was remarkable and they shared a fantastic amount of their learning with those hosting the session. The children then had a series of clues and riddles to solve by locating various artefacts within the museum to crack the code. Overall, as a school, we came 2nd on the leader board of local schools who had visited, so well-done children. The children made it to the bonus challenges and the final riddle, which was brilliantly solved by Jacob's group.

Following that, we then travelled over to Wisbech Castle, where we were greeted by 'Stories of the Fens', who acted out various stories from the Fenlands. Including a story about a Roman family who were attacked by Saxons and all that remained of them was a piece of a Roman pot, an eel who found a friend and the woman who would get suitors to give her gifts in exchange for her hand in marriage, just so she could run off with the gifts. They were absolutely brilliant; the children and adults were absolutely captivated throughout.

Our final activity in the local library, the children immersed themselves in creating an acrostic poem about nature and community, which they then folded and used as wings to slot inside their cut-out bird, which they decorated and is going to be proudly displayed in the classroom. They learned about the valuable services libraries provide, including how to borrow books, while having the opportunity to explore the wonderful collection of books available.

We all returned to school having had an absolutely amazing time. I would like to extend my gratitude to Mrs Connell and Mrs Hall who helped make this such a wonderful and memorable day for our children. The children behaved brilliantly and did the school very proud, so well done and thank you everyone.

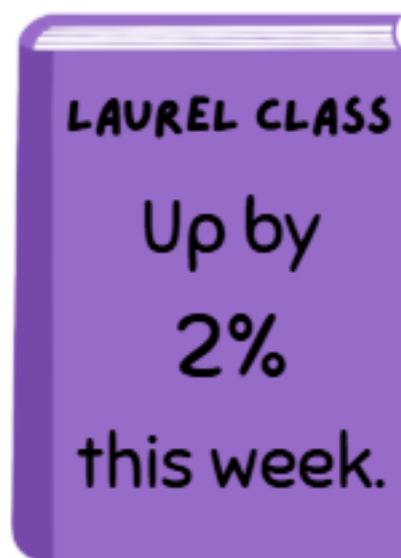
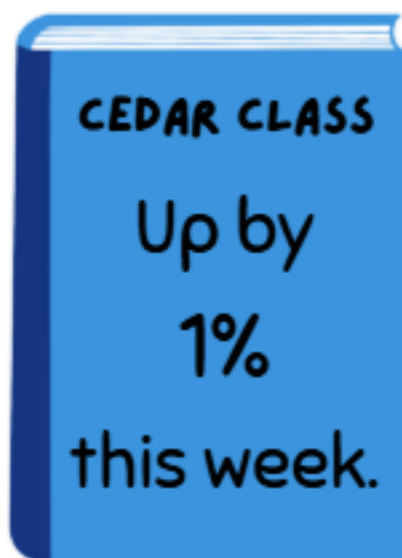


REMARKABLE READING

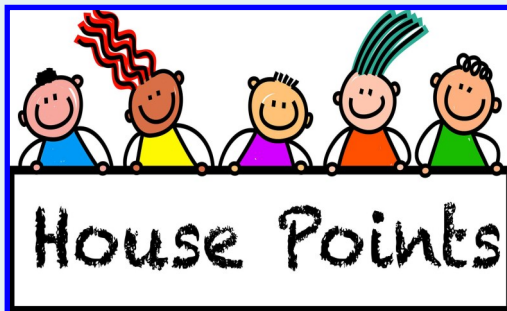
