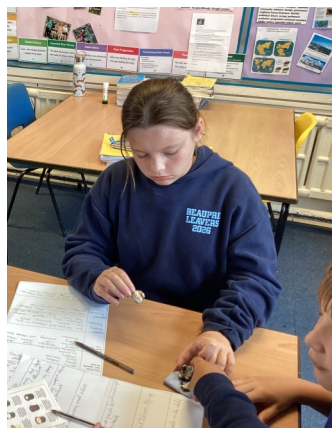
Shacklewell Hollow Awards

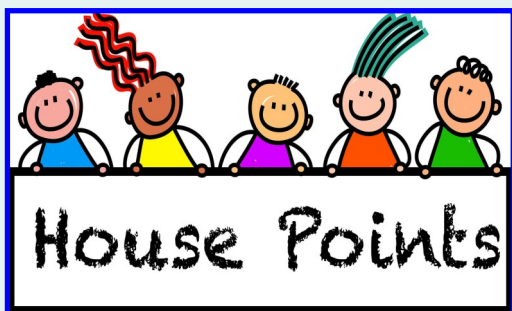
BEAUPRE'S SUNFLOWER COMPETITION

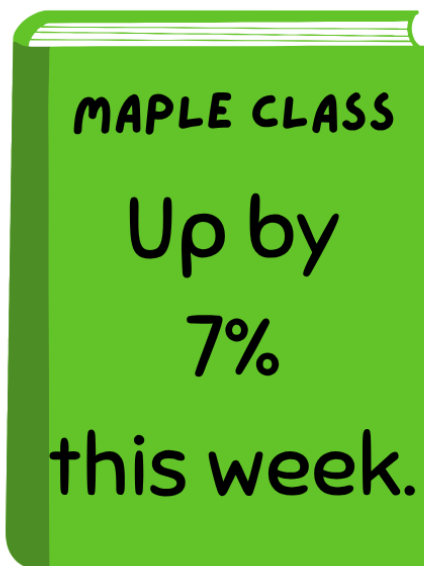
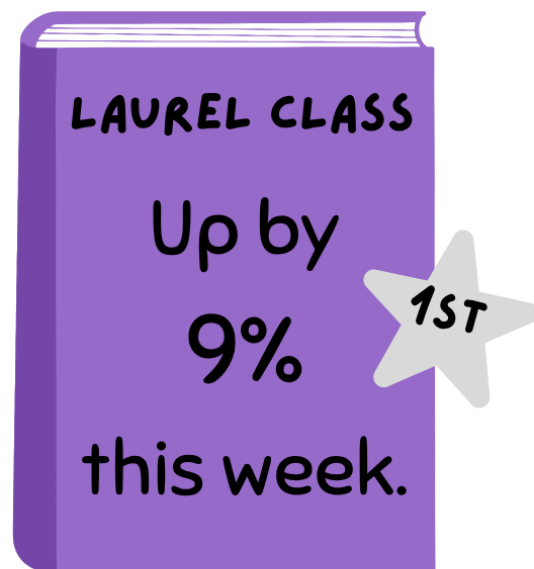
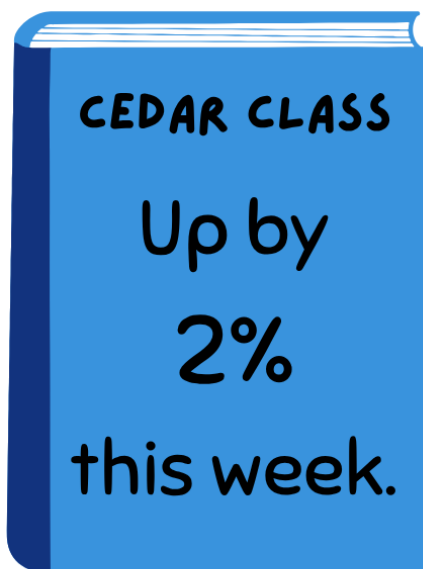
