Maple Class STEM Trip

On Thursday, Maple Class got to experience 'Behind the Buses Junior', a free school trip which was funded by Cambridge Science Centre and Stagecoach Buses.

The initial excitement of the day started when a double decker bus arrived outside the front of the school and the children were super excited to hear that they could sit on the top deck!

The first stop of the day was to Cambridge Science Centre, Wisbech, where we learnt all about the ins and outs of being an astronaut. The children learnt about the different forces in space and how astronauts have to adapt their ways of living. They also got to explore the gallery and enjoyed a range of activities which were available to them. A particular favourite was the wind tunnel where they could make objects from paper and see if they could get them to spin in the wind tunnel.



We then headed off to Stagecoach's bus depot in Peterborough. When we first arrived, the children experienced a bus wash, which we discovered was more comfortable than going through a car wash! The staff at Stagecoach had set up an array of activities for us. We were able to sit in the driver's seat of the bus, look at the underneath of a bus and connect electrical circuits. However, the two activities which the children loved the most were printing bus tickets and driving buses (dressed up mobility scooters) around a track.

We all had such a wonderful day and are so grateful for the team at Cambridge Science Centre and Stagecoach Buses for putting this trip together for us!

Pickleball Fun in the Sun

Year 3 and 4 took advantage of the lovely weather this week by learning to play Pickleball! The children very much enjoyed experiencing the sport with the West Norfolk Sports Partnership, who visited us on Wednesday to deliver the session. Thank you very much to our lovely visitors, we learned so much from you and we all had a brilliant time!



Water Safety Assembly

Thank you to Mr Roberts from Cambridgeshire County Council, who visited us earlier this week for a very informative water safety assembly. He shared lots of very important water safety information with us, that will help us all to stay safe in around water over the summer.

During the assembly children were reminded to stay least two steps away from the water's edge and to stay in groups at all times. Should they find themselves in difficulty in the water, they should float like a starfish and 999 should be called as soon as possible.

Well done to the children for showing such engagement and maturity around this subject. We received feedback from Mr Roberts afterwards that the children were "a real credit to themselves and the school"!

Please talk to your children about water safety, particularly with staying safe in pools and at the beach at this time of year. Below is further information on the council's new water safety campaign, Be Water Smart.

Designed to equip parents with important lifesaving knowledge, Be Water Smart aims to raise awareness of the potential risks of swimming in open water, like lakes and rivers, and the simple, proactive steps you as can take to ensure your children have the right skills and knowledge they need to stay safe around water.

- Making clay tree faces
- Natural art sketching
- Hammer and nail art

Children also took it upon themselves to collect ants for their friend's ant farm, build a bird hide and birdwatch from it and create an obstacle course for creatures. All in all, it was a thoroughly enjoyable morning. Thanks to our parents who joined us to make it that extra bit special.





Despite the recent hot weather, the children have continued to enjoy their playtimes while staying cool and safe. We have adapted activities where needed and ensured plenty of opportunities for shade, hydration, and quieter play.

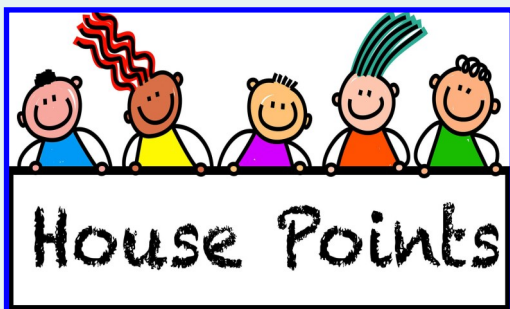

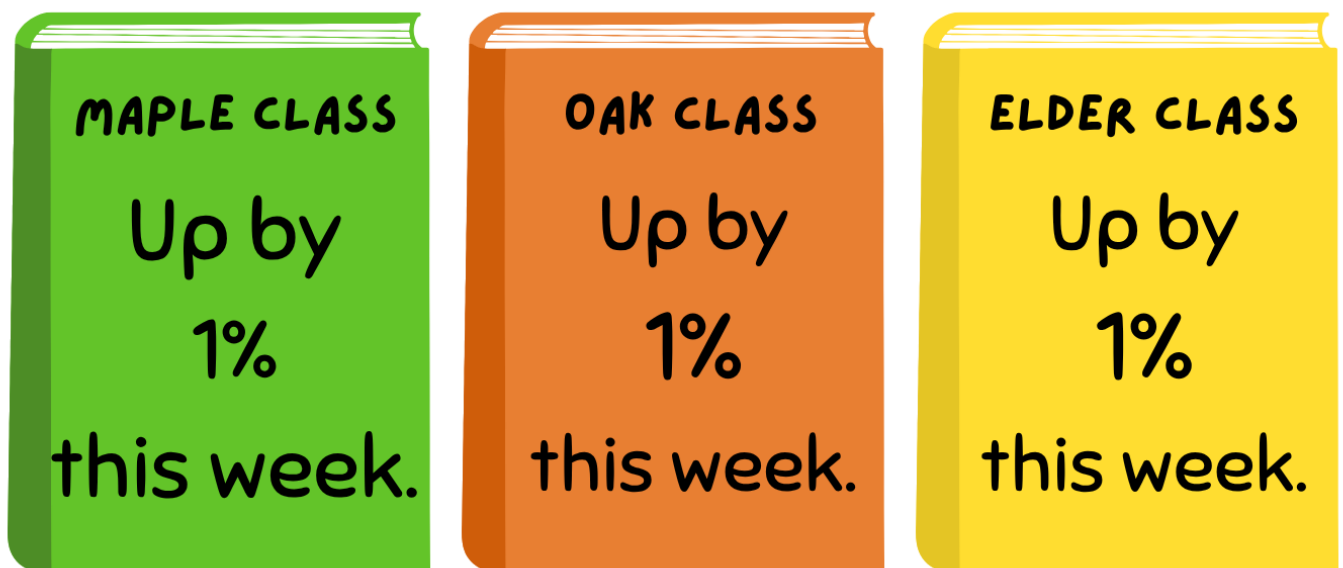
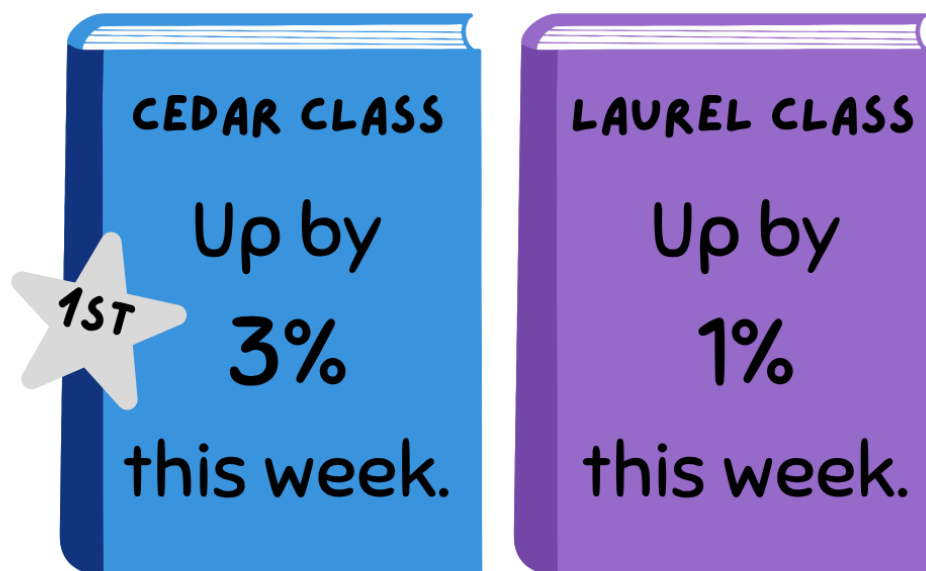
