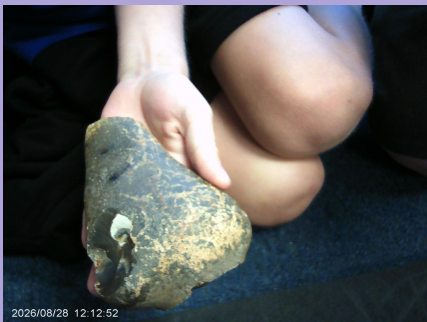
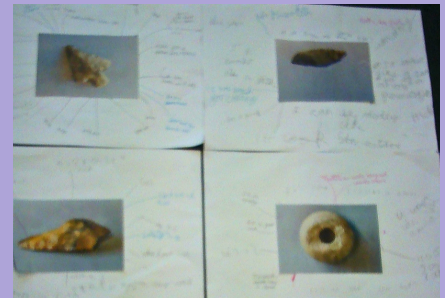
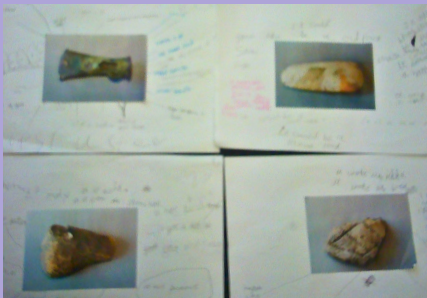

Wisbech Museum Box Fun

This week in Laurel Class we have had an exciting opportunity to handle real pieces of history! The class has been entrusted with a pre-history box from the Wisbech Museum, full of some very interesting historical items.

As a class, we have been looking at all the different artefacts inside, making sure we handle them carefully to keep them safe. Year 6 Brain Buddies

Year 6 were very lucky this week to have commenced their first session of Brain Buddies! This initiative, provided by the Mental Health Support Team, will take place weekly over the next term and will teach the children to develop a greater understanding of their thoughts, feelings and emotions.

The Mental Health Support Team is part of a national NHS programme that provides early mental health support in schools, helping children and young people build positive wellbeing skills. Throughout the programme, pupils will learn a range of practical strategies to support emotional regulation, including recognising emotions, managing worries, developing resilience and using healthy coping techniques when faced with challenges.

We look forward to seeing Year 6 engage with the sessions over the coming weeks and seeing them develop valuable tools to support their emotional wellbeing.

Chestnut Class Cycling

We are pleased to announce that going forward, Chesnut Class will be enjoying a new PE opportunity! On alternate weeks, when they are not in the woodland area, the children will have a class cycling session on the playground.

Children will have the opportunity to explore balance bikes, scooters and a range of gross motor equipment. They will practise wearing helmets safely, moving with control, steering, stopping and navigating around others. This session supports the development of balance, coordination, core strength and spatial awareness while building children's confidence and independence. It also encourages turn-taking, perseverance and an awareness of keeping themselves and others safe during physical play.

Parents do not need to provide anything for the session, but children who would like to bring their bikes/scooters in for OPAL play each day are also welcome to use them for these sessions.



Head Lice

AR Home Connect letters have been sent home with children this week.
