Yet again World Religion Day at Beaupre was incredibly successful for another year. Each class selected their chosen religion to immerse themselves in a day of engaging, creative, reflective and expressive activities

Blue Class spent the day as vegetarians, sampling exotic fruits and vegetables celebrating Sikhism. 
World Book Day

Love Reading

As a school we have been promoting reading and trying to engage the children in the opportunities that reading can provide them. We are all aware how technology is now a part of all our lives, but unfortunately, one of the downsides to this is that the vast majority of us do not read like we used to (children and adults).

Reading is so important to gain knowledge and is an opportunity to escape and be taken to places we possibly haven't been or considered before. As a school we have been trying to promote this to the children.

Your child's reading experience is much more than the reading book which comes home from school. Reading is happening all the time in a classroom and in the school. It is taught in specific reading and English lessons, but children are practising and using their 'reading' constantly across all subjects too.

Parents can support this 'reading journey' through regular reading at home. Reading to and with your child every evening for at least ten minutes can make a dramatic difference to a child's achievement within school.

Research:

A report from the Oxford University Press highlighted the importance of parents reading with their children. 'Children who read outside of class are 13 times more likely to read above the expected level for their age'.

The report also offers six tips for reading with your child at home, including:


- 1. Make time to read- even ten minutes a day
- 2. Choose different types of books
- 3. Take turns to read
- 4. Talk about the book- asking your child questions
- 5. Pay attention to the language
- 6. Enjoy reading

'The Reading Agency' research report states:

The research finds that reading for pleasure can result in increased empathy, improved relationships with others, reductions in the symptoms of depression and dementia, and improved wellbeing.

In addition to the health benefits, reading for pleasure has social benefits and can improve our sense of connectedness to the wider community. Reading increases our understanding of our own identity, improves empathy and gives us an insight into the world view of others.
