1	To introduce this half terms topic, 'The World Around Us'. We are going to be learning about The Rainforest.  What is a Rainforest? Watch the clip to find out. https://www.bbc.co.uk/teach/bring-the-noise/andys-raps-rainforest/zhghihv  Discussion — What is this song all about? What is a Rainforest? Are trees important? Why are they good? What lives in a Rainforest? Do people live there?  Where could we find out about Rainforests? We could use our computers or look in books. How would we do that? We cannot go to the library at the moment but if you have an atlas or an encyclopaedia you could ask your grown up to help you look.  Look at the website below. You don't have to join, it's free https://www.theschoolrun.com/homework-help/rainforest-habitats  • On the tree template, write a sentence to explain what a Rainforest is. Page number 11.  Challenge - You could also find out some more facts about the Rainforest and write about it.(Don't write about animals as we will do that another day)  Remember: Capital letters at the start of the sentence, full stops at the end,	Today we are going to use real objects to make double. But first watch the story of Alison Hubble by Allan Ahlberg. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=3BjX68jX6 Wg Ask your child questions to check their understanding. Eg What is a pair? Why did she need extra dinner money? What does double mean?  • Use a mirror to reflect the double group, Ask your child to verbalise what they are doing. Eg Double 2 is 4. You could use pasta, buttons, cereals -Cheerios.  Provide examples of doubles and non-doubles and ask your child to sort and explain why. The explanation is really important and demonstrates their understanding.  Challenge – start with 2 objects. Keep doubling the objects until you get to 128. Use a timer to see how long it takes you. Make sure you shout out what you are doing as you go!	Can you say the number that is before it, one more than, one less than? Can you count objects to this numbers? Can you write this number? 



