

In Red Class, Peter has been learning about habitats.




In Blue Class, Connie has been taking care of some caterpillars and this week she released the butterflies in to her garden.

Dear Yellow Class



Mrs Pepper's Super fruit ice lollies/cubes

You will need ...

- your favourite fruit, berries are a good choice as they give off so much flavour
- · sugar free lemonade
- ice cube tray/ice lolly mould (if you don't have any of these, you could use an empty, clean yogurt pot)

Prepare the fruit, washing it and slicing it. Place it into your ice cube tray or ice lolly mould, making sure you fill it well, so that the fruit doesn't move around too much when the liquid is added. Then fill with the sugar free lemonade. Pop them in the freezer and once they're frozen, away you go!

Use cocktail sticks to help you make your own lollipop sticks if you haven't got any moulds. You could even add water to your ice cubes, instead of lemonade and have them in your favourite drink


Get ready for the road

- Check that your bise is the right size: sitting on the saddle you should be able to touch the ground with one foot.
- Make sure that your clothes don't get in the way and that they are suitable for the weather.
- Hi-viz clothing is widely available and can make you more visible.
- Wearing a cycle helmet may reduce the risk of serious injury.
- When wearing a helmet you must make sure that it fits snugly and is level.
- If it is dark make sure that you have working lights: white at the front and red at the back.
- Don't carry things on your handlebars as this can affect steering. Use a rucksack or panniers.
