- A specialist Pupil Premium Teaching Practitioner providing planned interventions for all children meeting pupil premium criteria below\*
- Additional Teaching Assistant support for disadvantaged children with specific social and emotional needs for children meeting pupil premium criteria below\*
- To support Teaching Assistant led interventions in every class for children meeting pupil premium criteria below\*
- FREE Breakfast club for children meeting pupil premium criteria below\*
- FREE Music Tuition for children meeting pupil premium criteria below\*
- FREE Swimming transport for children meeting pupil premium criteria below\*
- FREE Educational visits for children meeting pupil premium criteria below\*
- FREE Beaupré School jumper available for children meeting pupil premium criteria below\*

\*Pupils registered for Pupil Premium funding(KS1), Pupils receiving Free School Meals (KS2), is a Looked after Child, has a parent in the Armed Forces or has been entitled to any of the criteria during the last six years

### Impact - Teacher Assessment Outcomes 2017

U = Unable to Assess; E = Emerging or above; D = Developing or above; S = Secure or above; M = Mastered.

Outcomes are shown as percentages. The outcomes for Emerging, Developing and Secure are cumulative (showing the percentage of pupils who are at this level or above).

The expected outcome for most pupils by the end of each year is Secure or above.

Data for cohorts is included to enable comparison with the whole class.

In Year 2, three out of four of the pupils eligible for Pupil Premium achieved at the expected standard in reading and half of the children achieved in writing and mathematics. 1 child achieved mastery in all 3 subjects.

In Year 4, seven out of ten disadvantaged pupils were Secure in maths and reading with six of them secure in writing. Almost half of this group also had SEN.

In Year 5, one half of the class were eligible for pupil premium funding- a very significant proportion. Of these pupils, 69% achieved secure in reading, 62% in writing, and 77% for maths an increase on their outcomes from last year.

Attendance overall, and for PP, has gone up since 2015-16.
